A reader who looks up all references to capital, money, labor, etc. (together with immediate cross-references) should be able to reconstruct, at least in broad outline, Marx's analysis of capitalism as seen from this particular vantage point. He will also have a fuller sense of the concepts, 'capital', 'money', 'labor', etc. than I have been able to offer even in the pages devoted to these subjects. The subsections for entries have been ordered with this dual aim in mind, though the numbering within each subsection is consecutive. Attention has also been given to include the specialized terms with which I expound Marx's philosophy of internal relations. Finally, footnote references only appear in the index if they involve a substantive point.
