This ambitious volume marks a huge step in our understanding of the social history of the Great War. Jay Winter and Jean-Louis Robert have gathered a group of scholars of Paris, London and Berlin, who collectively have drawn a coherent and original study of cities at war. The contributors explore notions of well-being in wartime cities – relating to the economy and the question of whether the state of the capitals contributed to victory or defeat. Expert contributors in fields stretching from history, demography, anthropology, economics, and sociology to the history of medicine bring an interdisciplinary approach to the book, as well as representing the best of recent research in their own fields. *Capital Cities at War*, one of the few truly comparative works on the Great War, will transform studies of the conflict, and is likely to become a paradigm for research on other wars.

JAY WINTER is a Fellow of Pembroke College, Cambridge. His previous publications in this series include *Sites of Memory, Sites of Mourning: The Great War in European Cultural History* and (co-edited with Emmanuel Sivan) *War and Remembrance in the Twentieth Century*.

JEAN-LOUIS ROBERT is Professor of History at the University of Orléans. He is the author of *Les ouvriers, la patrie et la Révolution: Paris 1914–1919* (1995).
