Bonnie Britton is a tutor in philosophy and logic and a PhD candidate at the University of Tasmania.

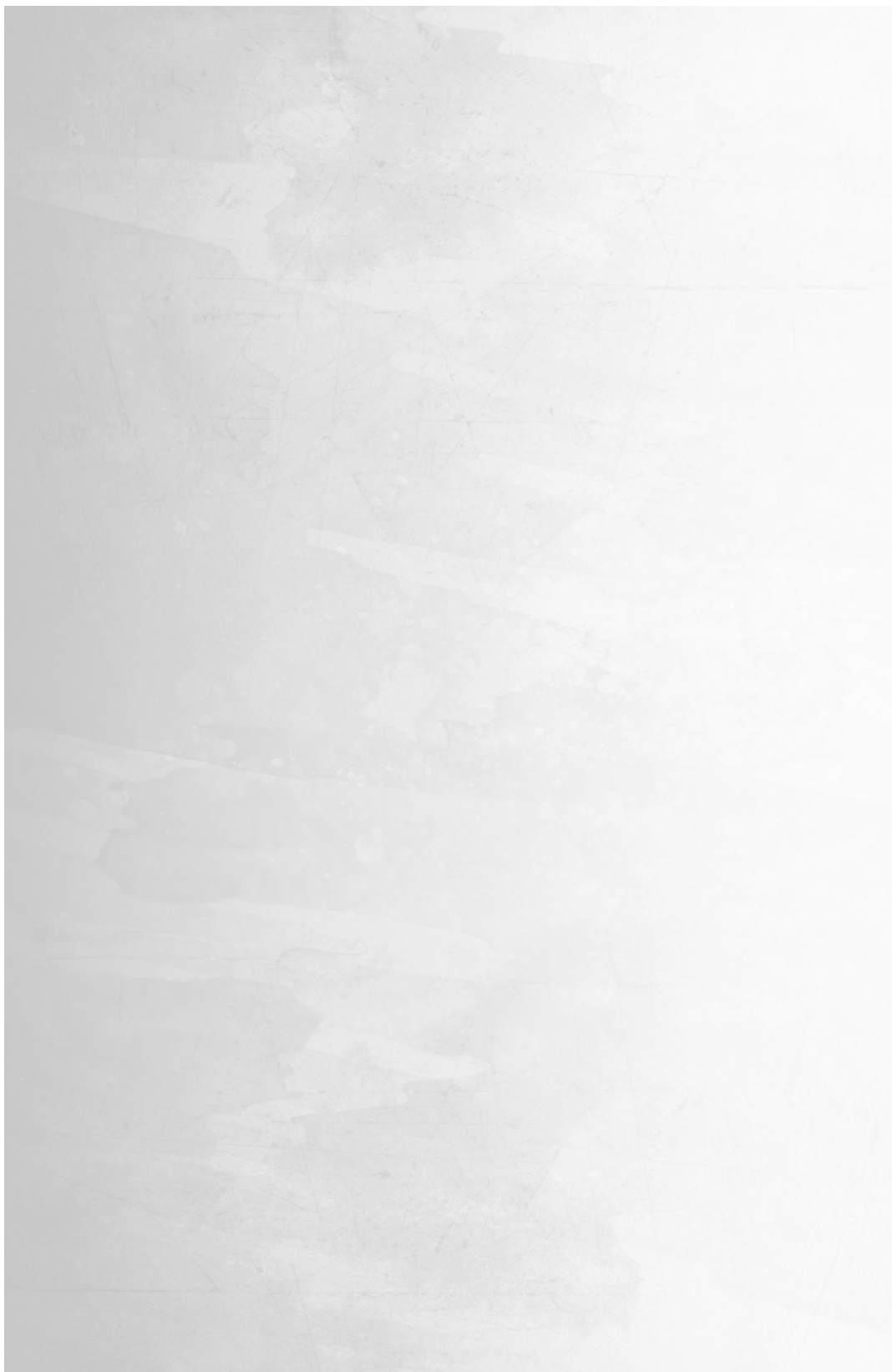
