

## **EPISTEME: A journal of individual and social epistemology**

EPISTEME is a general journal of epistemology in the analytic tradition that invites both informal and formal approaches. Among its primary “traditional” topics are knowledge, justification, evidence, reasons, rationality, skepticism, truth, probability, epistemic norms and values, and methodology. The journal devotes special attention to issues in social epistemology, including testimony, trust, disagreement, relativism, diversity and expertise, collective judgment, and the epistemic assessment of social institutions (e.g., science, law, democracy, and the media). The journal welcomes interdisciplinary approaches to epistemology that borrow methods from allied disciplines such as experimental psychology, linguistics, economics, game theory, evolutionary theory, and computer simulation studies. We do not publish purely historical work or case studies.

### **1. Submission of manuscripts**

All submissions to EPISTEME must be made through the ScholarOne Manuscripts site: <http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/epi>

Submissions should be made in Word doc format, or can be made in LaTeX format. LaTeX formatted submissions must be accompanied by a pdf version.

Papers should be double-spaced, in 12 point font, Times New Roman. Accepted papers are usually about 6,000-8,000 words long. However, we are willing to consider manuscripts as long as 12,000 words (and even more under very special circumstances). All self-identifying marks should be removed from the article itself to facilitate blind review. In addition to the article itself, an abstract should be submitted as a separate file (also devoid of author-identifying information).

If you request colour figures in the printed version, you will be contacted by CCC-Rightslink who are acting on our behalf to collect Author Charges. Please follow their instructions in order to avoid any delay in the publication of your article.

Submitting an article to EPISTEME implies that it is not under consideration (and has not been accepted) for publication elsewhere.

Authors of articles published in the journal will assign copyright to Cambridge University Press (with certain rights reserved) and will receive a copyright assignment form for their signature on acceptance of the paper. Authors must obtain written permission to publish any material of which they do not own the copyright.

## **2. Elements of style (etc.)**

1. Submissions should be in English, on consecutively numbered pages. Both American and UK spellings are acceptable as long as they adhere consistently to one or the other pattern.

### **English Language Editing Services**

Authors, particularly those whose first language is not English, may wish to have their English-language manuscripts checked by a native speaker before submission. This is optional, but may help to ensure that the academic content of the paper is fully understood by the editor and any reviewers. We list a number of third-party services specialising in language editing and / or translation, and suggest that authors contact as appropriate. Please see the [Language Services page](#) for more information. Please note that the use of any of these services is voluntary, and at the author's own expense. Use of these services does not guarantee that the manuscript will be accepted for publication, nor does it restrict the author to submitting to a Cambridge published journal.

2. Citations should be made in author-date format. A reference list of all works cited should be placed at the end of the article. See any issue for a guide to the appropriate style for references.

3. EPISTEME does not have a regular reviews section, so please do not send unsolicited books to either the publisher or the editor.

Typographical or factual errors only may be changed at proof stage, within a given deadline. The publisher reserves the right to charge authors for correction of non-typographical errors.

## **4. Offprints**

Each author will receive a pdf offprint of their article. Print offprints may be purchased from the publisher if ordered at proof stage
