Journal of Smoking Cessation is the world's only publication devoted exclusively to the treatment of smoking cessation. The journal is targeted specifically to the area of smoking cessation at the "grass-roots" level, focusing on observational studies that have practical implications for those assisting smokers to quit. It is a high quality peer-reviewed publication with an international editorial board that has itself wide experience in the field of smoking cessation.

The editor encourages submissions of case studies, letters to the editor and short studies. A regular feature of the journal is a section entitled 'What the Research Says ... In One Line'. This feature enables busy clinicians to view a wide variety of publications and reviews about research. All authors should clearly state their funding sources, conflicts of interest and pharmaceutical industry support. This journal will not publish articles supported by funding from the tobacco industry.

Submission

All manuscripts should be submitted online via our new manuscript submission and tracking site, <u>http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/josc</u>. Full instructions for electronic submission are available directly from this site. To facilitate rapid reviewing, communications for peer review will be electronic and authors will need to supply a current e-mail address when registering to use the system.

All articles are refereed. Papers submitted to the journal must not previously have been published nor submitted for publication to any other journal.

Articles may be submitted with a maximum of 8 author names listed per manuscript.

All submissions must be accompanied by the appropriate **Statements** as outlined below.

Format

Papers should be submitted via e-mail in Word or RTF format.

Cover letter

During submission you will be asked to provide a cover letter. Use this to explain why your manuscript should be published in the journal including a statement on what we already know about this topic and importantly, what this paper adds to what is already known. Authors may elaborate on any issues relating to our editorial policies in the *Journal of Smoking Cessation* in this letter.

Format

Papers should be submitted in Word or RTF format.

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Contributions should follow the format and style described in the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (5th ed.). Spelling and punctuation should conform to The Macquarie Dictionary (4th ed.). For matters of style not covered in these two publications the Style Manual for Authors, Editors and Printers (6th ed.) should be consulted.

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
