We are used to the idea of people believing in Christ, but did the early church consider that Jesus also had faith in God? This book evaluates the evidence, starting with a survey of the meaning of faith in Judaism and Graeco-Roman literature and proceeding to a detailed exegesis of the relevant New Testament material from the Synoptic Gospels, the Pauline and deutero-Pauline epistles, Hebrews and Revelation. Two trajectories of interest in Jesus' faith are identified: the paradigmatic, concerned with matters of discipleship, and the theological, relating Christ to God's gift of salvation. The examination is then broadened to trace the progress of these trajectories through the literature of the first four Christian centuries and concludes by identifying the Arian controversy as the christological development which rendered reference to Jesus' faith untenable within the emergent orthodoxy.



CONVENTION FOR REFERRING TO PRIMARY AND SECONDARY LITERATURE

Primary sources

Unless otherwise indicated, biblical translations are taken from the *Revised Standard Version*. Editions of primary sources and translations are cited wherever possible by series rather than by individual volume; details of these are provided in the list of abbreviations. If a reference does not indicate which edition has been used, the standard versions as defined in the primary sources section of the bibliography should be assumed. References to non-biblical primary sources adopt the following format; context determines how much of this information is relevant:

Primary source – author; work; book; chapter, section or page; verse, sub-section or line (e.g. Irenaeus, *Haer.* IV.37.5).

Edition (in square brackets): edition of text, usually by series; volume; page or column (e.g. Irenaeus, *Haer.* IV.37.5. [SC 100.933]).

Translation (preceded by trans.; an asterisk * indicates that the translation has been revised in some way): translation, usually by series; volume; page (e.g. Irenaeus, *Haer.* IV.37.5. [SC 100.933]; trans.* ANCL 9.39).

Secondary literature

Secondary literature is cited in the text and footnotes in abbreviated form, using the author, short title and page number convention. Full details are provided in the bibliography at the end.
