PREFACE

This book has its basis in a doctoral dissertation accepted by the University of Cambridge early in 1969. In its revision for publication, which was carried out in 1971, I endeavoured to take full account of literature written on the subject since the thesis had been submitted. Due to an unavoidable delay in publishing, I was later able to include reference to the bulk of the relevant material that appeared up until the beginning of 1973, though in this case only in the footnotes.

But for the encouragement of Dr Leon Morris of Ridley College, Melbourne, the way to pursuing research in England would have been considerably more difficult and it was Dr D. B. Knox of Moore College, Sydney, who suggested the idea of Liberty in the New Testament as a fruitful area of study. Financially, I received considerable help from the Tyndale Fellowship for Biblical Research and also appreciated the fine facilities provided for work of this nature at Tyndale House, Cambridge. Assistance was also received from various funds in the University of Cambridge enabling me to spend two extremely profitable terms at the Universities of Basle and Zürich towards the end of my research period. The Anglican Diocese of Sydney, the Inter-Varsity Fellowship of Australia and Moore Theological College also made helpful contributions.

Personally, I am especially grateful to Professor Eduard Schweizer for the stimulation of his seminar in Zürich. Methodologically this was of great benefit. Various comments of Professor J. D. M. Derrett of London University, who was kind enough to recommend the book for publication, prevented me from committing some errors in my treatment of the Jewish background to the gospel material. Above all, however, I am indebted to Professor G. W. H. Lampe for his general guidance throughout the initial course of research. Naturally he cannot be held responsible for the finished product. I would also like to record my appreciation of the typing assistance given by my mother, Mrs E. M. Banks, and by Miss W. Gordon during

various stages of the book's preparation and revision. And then the customary, but absolutely necessary, word of thanks to my wife and children who have lived for so many years in the shadow of this book and have given every encouragement throughout.
