
Index

This is a selective index, principally of proper names, although some themes are arranged under the headings *gender*, *Jacobitism* and *women*. Pope's works are arranged under his name, under the subheading *Works*; but his relationships are entered only under the names of others concerned. Main headings for individuals are placed under title rather than family name, and married name rather than maiden name, except in the cases of individuals who figure in the text only under a previous name.
