GENERAL INDEX

This index covers mainly personal names, place-names and names of peoples. These are given in the forms and spellings most familiar in English, with cross-references where the Latin or other forms used at the time, or those current today, diverge appreciably from these.

Denominations, legends, types and other features are indexed only when they are exceptional (e.g. obols, DN DS REX, graffiti, peck-marks). Only approximate localizations are given for familiar place-names easily found in any map or gazetteer, but for smaller localities more detailed indications are provided. Names of moneyers and find-spots are included only where these appear in the text; for those in the catalogue of coins, see the separate indices. Entries in the section Collectors, Dealers and Donors are not indexed.
