## BIOGRAPHICAL INDEX

We give here a few notes on persons who figure prominently, or to whom there are scattered references, in the letters, and particularly to bishops, abbots and archdeacons, who are arranged (as are earls, etc.) under their titles. It was originally intended to make this Index more elaborate (hence the references, not all fulfilled, in *JS Epp.* 1: see p. lxiv); but now that the new edition of Le Neve's *Fasti* (ed. under the auspices of the Institute of Historical Research) and *Heads of English Monastic Houses before 1215* (ed. D. Knowles, C. N. L. Brooke and V. London) are in active preparation, it seemed reasonable to restrict the scope of this Index. Notes on Gilbert Foliot's clerks, etc., and on men who held dignities or prebends at Hereford or St Paul's in his time, are collected in *GF*, Appendix iv. Persons referred to in only one letter or group of letters are not usually included here, but given a brief note in the context in which they occur. Dates of bishops are as in *Handbook* (2nd edn.).

**BADERON OF MONMOUTH**, lord of Monmouth, son of William son of Baderon, and so great-nephew of Wihenoc, the Breton founder of this lordship (*CDF*, no. 1142, etc.; Round in *Studies in Peerage and Family History*, pp. 120 ff.). *CDF*, no. 1138, may suggest that Baderon was not born in 1101–2; he had certainly succeeded by 1144 (*CDF*, no. 1142). He was still alive in 1170, dead by 1176 (*Sir Christopher Hatton's Book of Seals*, ed. L. C. Loyd and D. M. Stenton, p. 138). His wife, Rose, was daughter of Gilbert FitzRichard de Clare (Round, *Feudal England*, facing p. 473).

**BATH, BISHOP OF**, ROBERT, 1136–66 (died 31 Aug.); previously monk of Lewes. R. H. C. Davis in *EHR*, LXXVII (1962), 209–32, argues cogently that he was author of the *Gesta Stephani*, and also points out that there seems no available evidence that he was (as often stated) prior of Winchester. For his career at Bath and Wells, see J. Armitage Robinson, *Somerset Historical Essays*, pp. 55 ff.

— REGINALD FITZJOCELIN, son of the bishop of Salisbury (*q.v.*), born in Lombardy, archdeacon in the Salisbury diocese (prob. of Wiltshire) by 1161 and clerk of Thomas Becket; later deserted the archbishop (see nos. 206–8). El. bishop of Bath late April 1173, consec. 23 June 1174; el. archbishop of Canterbury 27 Nov. 1191, died 26 Dec. 1191. See *GF*, p. 56 and n.; *EC*, p. 19; J. A. Robinson, *op. cit.*, esp. pp. 106 ff.

**BAYEUX, BISHOP OF**, HENRY DE BEAUMONT: dean of Salisbury, c. 1155–65; el. bishop of Bayeux, 1165; died 1205. As dean, succeeded Robert, *q.v.* under Exeter, succeeded by John of Oxford, see under Norwich; see also Torigny, p. 225; *MB Epp.* 112; *EYC*, II, no. 1120 (occurs ? 1162–5). Torigny, p. 225, gives his election under 1165; he was referred to as bishop in late summer 1165 (*MB Epp.* 115, cf. 112–13). A document in the *cartulaire noire* of Bayeux cathedral (*Antiquus cartularius ec. Baioc.*, ed. V. Bourrienne, I, 62 ff.) shows that the see was vacant in 1164 (April, also September, see *ibid.* p. 154); a curiously garbled account of this in the *Gallia Christiana* (xi, 364) has misled later writers into thinking that Henry was already el. in 1164. He died in 1205 (Ann. Caen, *HF*, xviii, 349) on 18 Nov., according to *Gallia Christiana*, xi, 364–6. On him see S. E. ## BIOGRAPHICAL INDEX

BORDESLEY, ABBOTS OF, HAMO I AND II (?): 1138–c. 1155 (?), c. 1155–66 or later (occurs in *Cart. Trentham*, p. 316, with Hervey sheriff of Staffs. Delisle, *Recueil*, I, nos. XLVII, LI, suggest a vacancy c. 1155–8); *Cart. Stoneleigh*, pp. 15, 149, seem to show that there were two Hamos, but suggest that the second was abbot by c. 1153. Their successor, William, resigned in 1188 (*Ann. Waverley, Ann. Mon.* II, 245).

BRIAN FITZCOUNT, son of Count Alan IV, Fergant, of Brittany (*Anglo-Saxon Chron.*, E, s.a. 1127), possibly illegitimate; brought up in court of Henry I and married to Matilda of Wallingford, and so lord of the honour of Wallingford. From 1139 a staunch supporter of the empress (see no. 26); last heard of in 1153, when Duke Henry relieved him when besieged for the third time by Stephen. On his family, see *EYC*, iv, ch. II; on him, Round in *DNB*.

CANTERBURY, ARCHBISHOP OF, THEOBALD: abbot of Bec, el. 1136, blessed 1137; archbishop, el. 24 Dec. 1138, consec. 8 Jan. 1139, died 18 April 1161. See *GF*, pp. 88 ff.; above, Appendix II; Saltman, *passim*; *JS Epp.* I; and, for his dates as abbot of Bec, and of death, see *Vita Lanfranci* in *PL*, CL, 733–4; Torigny, pp. 130, 133, 135.

— THOMAS BECKET: royal chancellor and archdeacon of Canterbury, 1154/5–62; archbishop of Canterbury, el. 23 May, consec. 3 June 1162; died 29 Dec. 1170. As archdeacon, succeeded Roger, see under York. The facts of his career are still most conveniently collected in J. C. Robertson, *Becket, archbishop of Canterbury* (London, 1859), based mainly on materials now in *MB*. For recent studies, see Knowles, *Historian and Character*, ch. 6, and *EC*.

— RICHARD: monk of Christ Church, Canterbury, chaplain of Theobald, prior of Dover, 1157–73, el. archbishop, 3 June 1173, consec. 7 April 1174, died 16 Feb. 1184. On him see *DNB*; H. Mayr-Harting in *Journ. Eccl. Hist.* XVI (1965), 39–53; no. 220 and notes; for early career, Saltman, pp. 310, 542–3.

— BALDWIN: clerk of Bishop Robert II of Exeter, archdeacon of Totnes, c. 1161–70, monk of Forde, abbot of Forde before 1175–80; consec. bishop of Worcester 10 Aug. 1180, postulated archbishop of Canterbury December 1184, died 19 or 20 Nov. 1190. On him see *DNB*; Morey, pp. 105–9, 120–1; C. Holdsworth in *Trans. Royal Hist. Soc.* 5th series, XI (1961), 125; Duggan, pp. 110–15; Stubbs in *Epistolae Cantuarienses*, pp. xxxiii ff. and *passim*.

CANTERBURY, ST AUGUSTINE'S, ABBOT OF, SILVESTER: previously prior of St Augustine's, elected 1151, died 5 Aug. 1161 (William Thorne, ed. Twysden, pp. 1810–15).

— CLAREMBALD (intruded): 1162/3–74 (Thorne, pp. 1815–19; cf. Gervase, I, 173; *PR 20 Henry II*, p. 1, *21 Henry II*, p. 221, showing a vacancy mid 1174 to 1175).

— ROGER: monk of Christ Church, Canterbury, el. abbot, 9 Oct. 1175, died 20/21 Oct. 1212 (Gervase, I, 256; Thorne, pp. 1819–64). For the disputes about these abbots and their blessing and profession to the archbishop, see *JS HP* (P), pp. li–lvi, and articles of D. Knowles and E. John cited on p. 356.

CERNE, ABBOT OF, WILLIAM SCOTUS: monk of Caen, abbot 1114–44/5, deposed (*Anglo-Saxon Chron.*, H, s.a. 1114; for his deposition, Bernard's tenure, and William's reinstatement, see Appendix III).

— BERNARD: prior of Gloucester, abbot 1145–8, resigned and returned to Gloucester; later, abbot of Burton (1160–75 according to Ann. Burton, *Ann. Mon.* I, 187; but the annals are not trustworthy, and seem on the whole to be running a year late in this period. Gregory

of Caerwent (Cotton MS *Vesp. A. v*, fo. 199v), gives the dates 1160–73. But there is some confirmation that Bernard died in 1174 in the obits in *Monasticon*, III, 47–8, which give his death as Tuesday, 29 Jan.: this date was a Tuesday in 1174. But these obits are late and unreliable).

- WILLIAM SCOTUS, resumed c. 1148, died c. 1158 (his successor's appointment is noted under 1158 in *Torigny*, p. 198).
- CHESTER OR COVENTRY, BISHOP OF, ROGER DE CLINTON: nephew of Geoffrey de Clinton; archdeacon of Bucks, nominated October, consec. 22 Dec. 1129, died 16 April 1148 (cf. *Orderic*, IV, 429; *John of Worcester*, p. 29; *Henry of Huntingdon*, p. 303).
- WALTER DURDENT: prior of Christ Church, Canterbury, c. 1143–1149 (*Gervase*, I, 141; cf. *JS Epp.* I, 250 n.); consec. 2 Oct. 1149, died 7 Dec. 1159 (*JS Epp.* I, 266 n.).
- RICHARD PECHE: son of Bishop Robert Peche, archdeacon of Coventry, consec. before 18 April 1161, res. 1182, died 6 Oct. 1182. See *Diceto*, I, 305. He was very likely appointed archdeacon by his father, but first occurs 1135–47 (*Reg. Lichfield*, no. 169).
- CHICHESTER, BISHOP OF, HILARY: clerk of Henry of Blois bishop of Winchester, dean of Christ Church, Twynham (Hants), advocate at the papal Curia; nominated bishop 1146, consec. 3 Aug. 1147, died c. 13 July 1169. On him see *Knowles*, *EC*, pp. 24–7, etc.; H. Mayr-Harting in *EHR*, LXXVIII (1963), 209–24, and *The Bishops of Chichester, 1075–1207* (Chichester, 1963), pp. 7–12.
- JOHN OF 'GREENFORD': dean of Chichester and canon of St Paul's (see *GF*, p. 282), el. late April 1173, consec. 6 Oct. 1174, died 26 April 1180. See Mayr-Harting, *The Bishops of Chichester*, pp. 12–14.
- CIRENCESTER, ABBOT OF, ANDREW: ?c. 1147–76, died 27 Dec. (*Gesta Henrici*, I, 136; for the year, see also *Ann. Tewkesbury* and *Worcester*, *Ann. Mon.* I, 51; IV, 383). His predecessor, Serlo, occurs in a bull of 11 Feb. 1147, and Andrew is said to have succeeded in that year (*PUE*, III, no. 61; Browne Willis, *Mitred...Abbeys*, I, 61; Serlo's obit is 3 kal. Feb. in Leland, *Itinerary*, ed. L. T. Smith, I, 265–6).
- ADAM: 1177–c. 1183 (*Ann. Tewkesbury*, *Ann. Mon.* I, 52–3).
- CLUNY, ABBOT OF, PETER THE VENERABLE: son of Maurice de Montboissier, monk of Souci-lange, prior of Domaine, abbot of Cluny, el. Oct. 1122, died 25 Dec. 1156 (with a brief interval in 1125–6, when his predecessor, Pons, was restored). See *Vita*, Martène and Durand, *Amplissima Collectio*, VI, 1187–1202; J. Leclercq, *Pierre le Vénérable* (Saint-Wandrille, 1946); *Dict. de théologie catholique*, XII, 2065–81; *Petrus Venerabilis*, ed. G. Constable and J. Kritzeck (Rome, 1956); G. Constable's edition of his *Letters*, forthcoming.
- HUGH: 1157–61, deposed (actually left in 1163). On Hugh and Stephen, see no. 147 and n.
- STEPHEN BURGENSIS: el. 1161, established 1163, died 12 Aug. 1173 (*HF*, XII, 316; *Torigny*, p. 258; cf. p. 213; *Obit. Sens.* I, i, 450, 526). Previously abbot of Saint-Michel-l'Ecluse, and occurs as such in (?) 1154 (*HF*, XII, 325, 440, 453).
- DURHAM, BISHOP OF, WILLIAM OF SAINTE-BARBE: dean of York, c. 1135–43, el. bishop 14 March, consec. 20 June 1143, died c. 13 Nov. 1152. See C. T. Clay in *Yorks Arch. Journal*, XXXIV (1938–9), 364–5.
- HUGH DU PUSET: nephew of King Stephen, treasurer of York, 1143(?)–53, el. 22 Jan., consec. 20 Dec. 1153, died 3 March 1195. See G. V. Scammell, *Hugh du Puiselet, bishop of Durham* (Cambridge, 1956); Clay in *Yorks Arch. Journal*, XXXV (1940), 10–11.

- ELY, BISHOP OF, NIGEL:** nephew of Roger, bishop of Salisbury, archdeacon in Salisbury diocese (? Dorset), canon of St Paul's (prebendary of Chiswick), royal treasurer (temp. Henry I), bishop of Ely, nominated 28 May, consec. 1 Oct. 1133, died 30 May 1169. See *Liber Eliensis*, pp. 283 ff. (and 283 n.); Round in *DNB*; Knowles, *EC*, pp. 9–12; for his early offices, see also *Cart. Ramsey*, i, 23; Newcourt, i, 137; Richardson and Sayles, pp. 220–1.
- **GEOFFREY RIDEL:** royal clerk, keeper of the seal, archdeacon of Canterbury, 1163–73 or 1174, el. bishop of Ely late April 1173, consec. 6 Oct. 1174, died 21 Aug. 1189 (see Diceto, i, 308; note to no. 220; Delisle, *Recueil*, Introd. pp. 92–6; *DNB*).
- EVESHAM, ABBOT OF, REGINALD FOLIOT:** formerly monk of Gloucester, abbot 1130–49, died 25 Aug. (the dates of the abbots' deaths are as in BM Harl. MS 3763, fos. 169 ff., formerly 167 ff., printed in *Documents relating to the priory of Penwortham*, ed. W. A. Hulton, pp. 84 ff., unless otherwise stated; cf. *Chron. Evesham*, pp. 98–102). For Reginald, see *GF*, p. 36; for his dates, see also Ann. Winchcombe, in *Misc. D. M. Stenton*, pp. 126, 129; Gregory of Caerwent, Cotton MS Vesp. A. v, fos. 198, 199 (1130, 1149); for his accession, also *PR 31 Henry I*, p. 109, and charters dated 1130 and 1131 in his first year in BM Cotton MS Vesp. B. xxiv, fos. 27, 31. For his obit, also BM Lansd. MS 427, fo. 14.
- **WILLIAM DE ANDEVILLE:** monk of Christ Church, Canterbury (Ann. Winchester), prior of Dover, 1143–9 (Saltman, p. 542), abbot of Evesham, 1149–59, died 4 Jan. (? since the same obit is given for his successor). See Gervase, i, 141; Ann. Winchester in *Ann. Mon. II*, 56, Ann. Tewkesbury, *ibid.* i, 47. Cf. no. 89.
- **ROGER:** monk of St Augustine's, Canterbury, abbot 1159–60, died 4 Jan. (*Monasticon*, ii, 27; Harl. MS, confirmed by Lansd. MS 427, fo. 1; year of death is 1159 in Ann. Winchester, *Ann. Mon. II*, 56).
- **ADAM:** monk of La Charité, prior of Bermondsey, 1157–61, abbot 16 April 1161–91, died 12 Nov. (for accession see Ann. Bermondsey, *Ann. Mon. III*, 441). See no. 134.
- ÉVREUX, BISHOP OF, ROTROU, 1139–65:** see ROUEN.
- **GILES DU PERCHE,** nephew of Hugh of Amiens archbishop of Rouen, archdeacon of Rouen before 1142, el. bishop 1170, died 9 Sept. 1179. Early career: W. Levison, *England and the Continent in the Eighth Century*, p. 107; F. Lot, *St-Wandrille*, pp. 132, 136, 147, 150; R. N. Sauvage, *Troarn*, p. 370. Later career and death: Torigny, p. 247; *MB Epp. 730*; Delisle, *Recueil*, Introd. p. 363. These references (also *MB*, iii, 27; *Chron. Ste-Barbe*, p. 55) establish that his name could be variously spelt Egidius, Gilo and Giro; and *EYC*, i, no. 436 (= *CDF*, no. 19) offers the variant 'Gildo' and suggests that he may have been archdeacon already by 1135.
- EXETER, BISHOP OF, ROBERT WARELWAST:** nephew of bishop William Warelwast, royal chaplain, archdeacon of Exeter, c. 1133–8, nominated bishop 10 April 1138, consec. 18 Dec. 1138, died 28 March 1155 (*JS Epp.* i, 9 n.; Morey, pp. 114–16; *CDF*, no. 590; Exeter, Dean and Chapter MS 3518, fo. 9v—giving 28 March 1150, MCL, as date of death).
- **ROBERT II:** 'of Salisbury' (Ann. Plymton, *UGQ*, p. 30) or 'of Chichester' (late twelfth-century charter in *Reg. Stapeldon*, p. 112), dean of Salisbury, c. 1148–55 (v. Salisbury), consec. bishop 5 June 1155, died 10 March 1160 (10 March ?1159, Exeter MS 3518, fo. 6v).

- MASTER BARTHOLOMEW: archdeacon of Exeter, 1155–61, consec. after 18 April 1161, died 14 Dec. 1184 (*Morey, passim*; for dates, pp. 5 ff., 43, 117–18; *Howden*, II, 289; *Exeter MS 3518*, fo. 58v, has 14 Dec. 1184).
- GLOUCESTER, ABBOT OF, GILBERT FOLIOT: 1139–48. See *GF*, pp. 78–9, 96–7, and ch. v *passim*.
- HAMELIN: subprior of Gloucester, abbot 1148–79, died 10 March (*Cart. Gloucester*, I, 19, 22; *Ann. Winchcombe, Misc. D. M. Stenton*, pp. 129, 137).
- THOMAS CARBONEL: prior of St Guthlac's Hereford (*q.v.*), abbot 1179 (enthroned 17 Sept.)–1205, died 21 July (*Cart. Gloucester*, I, 22–3; *Ann. Winchcombe, op. cit.* p. 137).
- GLOUCESTER, EARLS OF, ROBERT: illegitimate son of Henry I, born c. 1090, earl 1122, died 31 Oct. 1147 (*CP*, V, 683–6, XI, Appendix D, p. 106). He married Mabel, daughter of Robert FitzHamon. See *GF*, pp. 115–17, 142–3, etc.
- WILLIAM, son of Robert, earl 1147–83, died 23 Nov. (*CP*, V, 687–9). He married Hawise, daughter of Robert, earl of Leicester.
- HEREFORD, BISHOP OF, ROBERT DE BETHUNE: prior of Llanthony (occurs ?c. 1123, *Ancient Charters*, no. 11), consec. bishop 28 June 1131, died 16 April 1148. See *GF*, pp. 21 ff., etc.; *Vita in Anglia Sacra*, II, 293–321 (a new edition has been prepared as an Oxford B.Litt. thesis by Miss B. J. Parkinson); for dates *ibid.* II, 304–5, 307, 314 ff., esp. 319; *Ann. Winchcombe*, in *Misc. D. M. Stenton*, p. 126. Torigny, p. 121, calls him a Fleming. For bishops' obits see obituary cited in *GF*, p. 33 n.
- GILBERT FOLIOT: 1148–63. See *GF*, pp. 96–9.
- ROBERT DE MELUN: English by origin, eminent scholar, taught at Paris and Melun, consec. 22 Dec. 1163, died 27 Feb. 1167. On him see *Dict. de théologie catholique*, XIII, 2751–3.
- ROBERT FOLIOT: protégé of Bishops Alexander and Robert de Chesney, canon of Lincoln and Hereford, archdeacon of Oxford 1151–73/4, el. bishop of Hereford late April 1173, consec. 6 Oct. 1174, died 9 May 1186. See *DNB*; *GF*, pp. 44 f., etc.; *JS Epp.* (ed. Giles), no. 317; below, *s.v.* Oxford; early references are in *Cart. Thame*, II, 104; *Cart. Missenden*, I, 78; *Danelaw Charters*, p. 213. He was a clerk of Archbishop Thomas in 1163, but did not follow him into exile in 1164 (*Cart. Ramsey*, II, 197; *Chron. Ramsey*, p. 306; *MB*, III, 524).
- HEREFORD, EARL OF, MILO OF GLOUCESTER: son of Walter of Gloucester, succeeded father c. 1126, royal constable, joined empress 1139, earl 25 July 1141, died 24 Dec. 1143. Related to Gilbert Foliot: see *GF*, pp. 35 ff.; on Milo see also D. Walker in *Trans. Bristol and Glos. Archaeol. Soc.* LXXVII (1958–9), 66 ff.; *CP*, VI, 451–4; *Handbook*, p. 431 and n. Married Sybil, daughter of Bernard of Neufmarché.
- ROGER: son of Milo, earl 1143–55; became a monk of Gloucester and died in 1155. See Walker in *op. cit.* LXXXIX (1960–1), 174 ff.; *CP*, VI, 454–6; R. H. C. Davis in *Misc. D. M. Stenton*, pp. 139 ff.; *GF*, pp. 36–7. Founder of Flaxley abbey (Glos, Cist.); married Cecily, daughter and heiress of Payne FitzJohn, sheriff of Herefordshire and Salop.
- HEREFORD, ST GUTHLAC'S PRIORY, PRIOR OF, WARIN: occurs 1143–8 (no. 21). St Guthlac's was formed in 1143 (p. 55 n. 3 and references) by amalgamation of the churches of St Guthlac and St Peter. A John, prior of St Peter's, occurs 1131–7 (Harl. MS 6976, fo. 14v); and it is possible that St Peter's was conventional. But it is more probable that it was then a mere cell, and that the formation of conventional life, and the appointment of Warin, followed the foundation of St Guthlac's in 1143.

- ERNULF: occurs 1148–52, 1148–55 (Balliol MS 271, fos. 34v–35, 79v; no. 333).
  - ROBERT: occurs 1148–55 or 1159–60 (no. 325).
  - OSBERN: occurs 1168, 2 Oct. 1172 (Balliol MS 271, fos. 16, 107v).
  - THOMAS CARBONEL: promoted abbot of Gloucester in 1179 (*q.v.*).
  - WILLIAM: occurs 1184 (no. 379).
- LEICESTER, EARL OF, ROBERT II: born 1104, earl 1119, chief justiciar (with Richard de Lucy) c. 1155, died 5 April 1168. Twin brother of Waleran, count of Meulan and earl of Worcester (1104–66). Married Amice, daughter of Ralph, seigneur of Gaël and of Montfort (Brittany), who had previously been betrothed to Richard, illegitimate son of Henry I, lost in White Ship in 1120. Amice survived her husband and is said to have entered the convent at Nuneaton. See *CP*, vii, 527–30; L. Fox in *EHR*, liv (1939), 385–402; and on Waleran, *CP*, vii, 737 ff.; and G. H. White in *Trans. Royal Hist. Soc.* 4th series, xiii (1930), 51 ff., xvii (1934), 19 ff.
- LINCOLN, ARCHDEACON OF, ROBERT ‘IUNIOR’: before 1145–71 (?), died 15 Jan. (cf. *Giraldi Cambrensis Opera*, vii, 154). On these archdeacons, see K. Major in *Reg. Lincoln*, vii, 202–5. Miss Major points out that it cannot be proved that all the references to Robert were to a single man, and that Richard d’Ameri may have held the archdeaconry for a time; but he was certainly archdeacon of Stow, and in our view probably only of Stow. *PR 16 Henry II*, p. 147, may indicate that he died in 1170, but ‘mortuus est’ is a later addition. Robert was custodian of the see 1166/7–70/1 (*PR 13 Henry II*, pp. 57–8; *16 Henry II*, p. 152).
- GEOFFREY, SON OF HENRY II: archdeacon, 1171–3, bishop elect of Lincoln, 1173–82; royal chancellor 1181/2–9; archbishop of York, el. 1189, consec. 1191, died 1212. See *GF*, p. 283; Delisle, *Recueil*, Introd. pp. 103 ff.
- LINCOLN, BISHOP OF, ALEXANDER: nephew of Roger, bishop of Salisbury, archdeacon in the Salisbury diocese (? Salisbury: occurs 1121), nominated bishop April, consec. 22 July 1123, died c. 20 Feb. 1148 (*Reg. Regum Anglo-Normannorum*, ii, no. 1301; John of Worcester, ed. Weaver, p. 17; Henry of Huntingdon, p. 245; *DNB*).
- ROBERT DE CHESNEY: uncle of Gilbert Foliot (*GF*, p. 33 and n.), archdeacon of Leicester c. 1135–48, el. bishop 13 Dec., consec. 19 Dec. 1148, died prob. 27 Dec. 1166. On his family see *Cart. Eynsham*, i, 411 ff.; *GF*, pp. 33 ff. As archdeacon he succeeded Walter, who died 26 April (*Giraldus Cambrensis, Opera*, vii, 157), perhaps in 1135 (*Henry of Huntingdon*, pp. 297, 319, 297–8 n.; cf. *Reg. Lincoln*, ii, no. 553). For his election, etc., see nos. 80–1 and references. *PR 13 Henry II*, pp. 57–8, shows that he died c. Christmas 1166, and this explains why the chroniclers are divided between 1166 and 1167 for the year (1166: Ann. Tewkesbury, Worcester, Winchester, *Ann. Mon.* i, 49, iv, 381, ii, 59; 1167—i.e. prob. on or after Christmas Day 1166—William of Newburgh, *Chron. of the reigns of Stephen, etc.* i, 154 (cf. 117 n. 3), Ann. Oseney, Wikes, *Ann. Mon.* iv, 33; the two latter give a vacancy of 16 or 17 years before the consec. of Walter of Coutances on 3 July 1183; the *Magna Vita* of St Hugh (ed. D. L. Douie and H. Farmer, NMT, 1961–2), i, 93, makes it 15 years. Torigny (p. 229) shows that he died before Lent 1167. Diceto (i, 329) makes him die 7 kal. Feb. 1167; Howden (i, 269) 6 id. Jan. It is highly probable that the latter is a scribal error for 6 kal. Jan., which is the date in the twelfth-century Lincoln obituary (*Giraldi Cambrensis Opera*, vii, 164; cf. p. 36 n.). The latter makes 27 Dec. 1166 the most probable date. The report of his death in *MB Epp.* 254 of early Nov. 1166 (certainly before 18 Nov.) must have been exaggerated. On him see Knowles, *EC*, pp. 15–16.

- LLANDAFF, BISHOP OF, URBAN: 1107–34 (on him, see *SEBC*, pp. 218 ff.; Conway Davies, I, 148 ff.; II, 515 ff.).
- UHTRED: apparently archdeacon of Llandaff (*ibid.* II, 519; occurs 1126), bishop 1140–8, died 1 Feb. (so Ann. Winchcombe, in *Misc. D. M. Stenton*, p. 129. *Handbook*, 1st ed. p. 198 n., and Conway Davies, II, 637, suggest divergent evidence in other sources, but T. Jones's translations of the *Brut y Tywysogion* (Peniarth MS, Cardiff, 1952, p. 56; *Red Book of Hergest*, 1955, p. 131) show that the original read '1148'; Uhtred was certainly alive late in 1147, when nos. 70–1 were addressed to him, and dead by March 1148 (see below)).
- NICHOLAS: monk of Gloucester, consec. bishop 14 March 1148, died 6 July 1183 (on him see Conway Davies, II, 521–2; but the view that he was *sacrist* of Gloucester rests on Giles's reading in no. 13. For the date of his consecration see *ibid.* II, 645; C. E. Woodruff in *Trans. St Paul's Ecclesiast. Soc.* VII (1911–15), 169; 14 March 1148 was a Sunday).
- LONDON, BISHOP OF, ROBERT DE SIGILLO: royal clerk, keeper of the seal from 1133, became monk at Reading, appointed bishop, June 1141, by the empress, died 29 Sept. 1150 (*Reg. Regum Anglo-Normannorum*, II, p. x; H. W. C. Davis in *Essays...presented to R. L. Poole*, pp. 181–2 (cf. Florence of Worcester, II, 131); Hexham, p. 309. Hexham, p. 324, gives 1151 for his death, but the years have been altered, wrongly, in the MS, and one should read 1150 with *UGQ*, p. 82 (and Gervase, I, 142—but his witness is confused). The earliest St Paul's obituary, MS W.D. 12, fo. 14, gives 29 Sept. as the day; a later one gives 28th). Cf. Brooke in *Hist. of St Paul's*, pp. 27–8.
- RICHARD DE BELMEIS II: nephew of Richard de Belmeis I (bishop 1108–27), archdeacon of Middlesex before 1127; temporarily supplanted, but reinstated 1138, el. 1152, consec. 28 Sept. 1152, died 4 May 1162. On him and his family (he was related to Gilbert Foliot), see *GF*, pp. 43, 202 ff.; *CHJ*, x, ii (1951), 125 f.; Stubbs, introd. to Diceto, and Diceto, I, 250 ff.; Eyton, *Salop*, VIII, 212 ff.; above, nos. 99–103, 109, 139–40 and notes to no. 99.
- GILBERT FOLIOT: 1163–87 (see *GF*, pp. 99–103).
- LONDON, HOLY TRINITY PRIORY, ALDGATE, PRIOR OF, RALPH: previously subprior, el. 17 Jan. 1147, died 14 Oct. 1167. These dates and those of Prior Stephen are supplied by the *Historia in Cart. Holy Trinity*, Hunterian MS (Glasgow University Library) U. 2. 6, fo. 5r–v (printed by T. Hearne in his edition of William of Newburgh, III, 705–7). According to this, Ralph's death was followed by a vacancy of 2 years, 32 weeks, 1 day, when the priory's affairs passed under the name of a fictitious Prior Edward or Edmund (see Appendix V, no. 5). Whatever the meaning of this rigmarole, the *Historia* seems to have overlooked the tenure of one or two short-lived priors, Osbern (?) and William.
- ? MASTER OSBERN: previously prior of Cirencester, occurs as such 1167–8 (*Cart. Oseney*, v, 27); elected prior 1167–8 (no. 187), but there is no evidence that he actually moved to London.
- WILLIAM: occurs 1169 (*MB Epp.* 527). But the evidence for him consists of a single letter, only surviving in MS D. It is possible that Osbern and William were never fully accepted as priors, and/or that William did not exist. It is more likely that the author of the *Historia* misunderstood the records of his house.
- STEPHEN: el. 17 May 1170, deposed 2 May 1197, died 14 Aug. 1198.

**MALVERN, GREAT, PRIOR OF, ? RICHARD:** see no. 28: if the reading of MS H is correct the prior in 1144–8 was Richard. His predecessor seems to have been Walcher, the scientist, who died 1 Oct. 1135 (J. Nott, *Some of the Antiquities of 'Moche Malverne'*, p. 28).

— **ROGER MALEBRAUNCHE:** occurs 1159, c. 1158–69 (*Monasticon*, III, 455; Nott, *op. cit.* pp. 40–1); became abbot of Burton in 1177 (*Gesta Henrici*, I, 180: c. 1 July; Ann. Burton, *Ann. Mon.* I, 187, gives 1178, but several of its dates seem slightly wrong—see *Cerne*. The late and unreliable list of abbots in *Monasticon*, III, 48, gives his predecessor's obit as Friday, 17 Nov. 1177; for what it is worth, 17 Nov. was Friday in 1176. But the annals also give 1177 for this. The annals and list of abbots agree that Roger died in 1182, but the details in the latter fit no year between 1181 and 1183).

— **WALTER:** c. 1177–c. 1216 (see no. 239 and notes).

**NEVERS, BISHOP OF, BERNARD DE ST-SAULGE:** 1159–76, died 9 or 15 Jan. (Ann. Nevers, *MGH, Scriptores*, XIII, 88–91; obit. Sens, *Obituaires de la province de Sens*, III, 464; cf. *Gallia Christiana*, XII, 639–40).

**NORFOLK, EARL OF, HUGH BIGOD:** born ?c. 1095, earl Dec. 1140 or Jan. 1141, died shortly before 9 March 1177. See nos. 159–61 and notes; *CP*, IX, 579–86.

**NORWICH, BISHOP OF, WILLIAM DE TURBA:** prior of Norwich, el., consec. 1146, died 16 Jan. 1174 (Knowles, *EC*, pp. 31–3; Saltman, pp. 102–3, for el.; *Reg. Norwich*, pp. 70, 76, 82).

— **JOHN OF OXFORD:** son of Henry of Oxford (sheriff: *Cart. Osene*, II, 80), royal clerk, rector of St Mary and (?) St Peter-in-the-East, Oxford, dean of Salisbury 1165–75 (see *Salisbury*), el. 26 Nov. 1175, consec. 14 Dec., died 2 June 1200. See Delisle, *Recueil, Introd.* pp. 397–8; Knowles, *EC*, pp. 111–12; *Cart. Osene*, I, 242, 306; *Reg. Norwich*, pp. 76, 82.

**OXFORD, ARCHDEACON OF, WALTER:** occurs 1111–12, died 1151 (*Chron. Abingdon*, II, 120; H. E. Salter in *EHR*, XXXIV (1919), 384). Associate of Geoffrey of Monmouth (referred to in preface of *Hist. Regum Britanniae*).

— **ROBERT FOLIOT** (see Hereford): 1151–73 (for date of appointment, see Salter, *loc. cit.*).

**OXFORD, EARL OF, AUBREY DE VERE:** son of Aubrey de Vere, Master Chamberlain; born c. 1110, count of Guînes, 1140/1, earl of 'Cambridge' 1142 (but took title Oxford), supported Stephen except in 1142–3; died 1191. Married (1) Beatrice, heiress of Guînes, in or before 1139; marriage dissolved; (2) in or before 1152, Euphemia, daughter of William de Canteleu; died 1153/4; (3) Agnes, daughter of Henry of Essex—see nos. 162–4 and notes. His brother, Geoffrey de Vere, was lord of Clun (Salop), sheriff of Suffolk (temp. Stephen) and Salop (1167–70); he married as his second wife Isabel, daughter of Elias de Say, lord of Clun (see no. 117). See *CP*, X, 199–207 and App. J, p. 113.

**POITIERS, BISHOP OF, JOHN OF CANTERBURY, OR AUX BELLESMAINS:** born at Canterbury, clerk of Archbishop Theobald, treasurer of York 1153/4–62 (also canon of St Paul's, see *GF*, p. 286), bishop of Poitiers 1162–82, archbishop of Lyons 1182–93; resigned to be monk of Clairvaux, died c. 1204. See C. T. Clay in *Yorks Arch. Journ.* XXXV (1940–3), 11–19; P. Pouzet, *L'Anglais Jean dit Bellesmains...* (Lyon, 1927); *JS Epp.* I, pp. xxvii, xxviii and nn.; Saltman, p. 214.

**RALPH OF WORCESTER,** landlord in Worcs and Glos under Stephen and Henry II (see esp. *Cart. Winchcombe*, I, 65; also Round, *Geoffrey de Mandeville*, p. 53 and n.).

— REGINALD (RAINALD): 1154–8; resigned, later pr. and abb. Saffron Walden (see p. 477 and n.; *Flores Historiarum*, II, 72, 75; Ann. Reading, *EHR*, XXXVII (1922), 400).

— ROGER: 1158–65, died 20 Jan. (Ann. Reading *ut supra*, 400–1; *Flores Historiarum*, II, 75; Ann. Winchester, *Ann. Mon.* II, 58; obit, fo. 11v).

— WILLIAM THE TEMPLAR: abbot 1165–73; archbishop of Bordeaux, consec. 25 Feb. 1173, died (?) 15 Sept. 1187 (Delisle, *Recueil*, Introd. p. 474; Ann. Reading, *ut supra*, p. 401; *Flores Historiarum*, II, 84; *HF*, XII, 443; *Gallia Christiana*, II, 818–19).

ROGER DE PORT, lord of Kington (Herefs) and Mapledurwell (Hants), son of Adam de Port, founder of Andwell priory (Hants) and sheriff of Herefs. Adam was alive 1130, but probably died soon after; Roger occurs in 1143; he became a monk at Andwell before his death. His retirement took place well before Theobald's confirmation to Andwell priory (Saltman, pp. 236–7, prob. 1150–4), since it confirms grants by his son and successor, Adam II. Married Sybil d'Aubigny. On the Ports, see J. H. Round in *Genealogist*, New Series, XVI (1900), 1–13; XVIII (1902), 137–9; additional information in *PR 31 Henry I*, pp. 14, 18, 123 (Adam alive 1130); *Cart. Gloucester*, III, 257; Winchester College Muniment Room, Andwell Drawer, nos. 5–6, 8–11, 15, esp. no. 9; *Cart. Wardon*, no. 276.

ROUEN, ARCHBISHOP OF, ROTROU: son of Henry, earl of Warwick, archdeacon of Rouen (Orderic, V, 119), bishop of Évreux 1139–65, archbishop of Rouen 1165–83, died late November. See Delisle, *Recueil*, Introd. pp. 454–6; and for his dates, Orderic, V, 119, 163; Torigny, pp. 139 (s.a. 1140), 225, 308; Torigny, ed. Delisle, II, 228, 124 ('1182'); *HF*, XVIII, 336 and n., 348 (1183); *Gesta Henrici II*, I, 308 (1183). His obit is 24 Nov. in obituary of St-Victor (*Obituaires de la province de Sens*, I, i, 602); 25 Nov. in obit. Évreux and Mont-St-Michel; 26 Nov. in obit. Rouen; 28 Nov. in obit. Jumièges (*HF*, XXIII, 465, 581, 369, 422; but in the last he is placed together with Archbishop Geoffrey, and the decision probably lies between 25 and 26 Nov.).

ST DAVIDS, BISHOP OF, BERNARD: royal clerk, chaplain of Queen Matilda, consec. bishop 19 Sept. 1115, died 22 April 1148. On him see Conway Davies, I, 114 ff. and *passim*; Brooke in *SEBC*, pp. 215–18, and, for his death, p. 218 n.

— DAVID FITZGERALD: uncle of Gerald of Wales, archdeacon of Cardigan, consec. bishop 19 Dec. 1148, died 8 May 1176. On him see Conway Davies, I, 268–84; cf. *Giraldi Cambrensis Opera*, III, 50, 154–5; Woodruff in *Trans. St Paul's Ecclesiast. Soc.* VII (1911–15), 169.

SALISBURY, BISHOP OF, JOCELIN DE BOHUN: nephew of Engelger de Bohun, archdeacon of Winchester under Henry of Blois (occurs 1139–42, *CDF*, no. 157; cf. Hexham, p. 302; predecessor occurs 1126–9, prob. 1128–9, *Anglia Sacra*, I, 279); bishop 1142–84, resigned, died 18 Nov. 1184. On him see Knowles, *EC*, pp. 17–22, 157 and *passim*; *GF*, pp. 55–6.

SALISBURY, DEAN OF, AZO: before 1139–1145/8. For the succession of deans, see K. Edwards in *VCH Wilts*, III, 207–8; on Azo, also J. Fowler in *Notes and Queries for Somerset and Dorset*, XXIII (1942), 319–20. He may have been the Azo who was previously archdeacon (of Wilts?), brother of Roger of Ramsbury, archdeacon of Wilts (?) after Azo—for these and other possibilities see Brooke in *CHJ*, XII (1956), 16 n.; it is also possible that Roger of Ramsbury should be identified with Roger le Poer, royal chancellor 1135–9, son of Bishop

— ROBERT, occurs 1148; bishop of Exeter in 1155 (*q.v.*).

— HENRY DE BEAUMONT: c. 1155–64, bishop of Bayeux (*q.v.*).

— JOHN OF OXFORD: 1165–75, bishop of Norwich (*q.v.*). On both these, see Edwards, *loc. cit.*, and above under Bayeux.

TEWKESBURY, ABBOT OF, ROGER: 1137–61 (Ann. Tewkesbury, *Ann. Mon.* i, 46, 49—called Robert under 1161, but this seems to be a slip for Roger, who was still abbot on 13 Dec. 1157, *Cart. Gloucester*, ii, 106).

— FROMUND: 1162–78 (Ann. Tewkesbury, *Ann. Mon.* i, 49, 52). For the troubles leading to his election, see nos. 135–7.

WESTMINSTER, ABBOT OF, GERVASE OF BLOIS: son of King Stephen, blessed as abbot 18 Dec. 1138 (possibly el. 1137), deposed in or about 1157. On the dates of these abbots see *Flete*, pp. 142–4; cf. P. Chaplain in *Misc. D. M. Stenton*, p. 90 n. On Gervase, see Chaplain, *ibid.* pp. 90 ff.; Richardson and Sayles, pp. 413 ff.

— MASTER LAURENCE: c. 1158–73 (cf. *PR 19 Henry II*, p. 184, *21 Henry II*, p. 79, for this vacancy). Previously monk of St Albans; died 10 April (Trinity Coll., Cambridge, MS O. 9. 25, fo. 137v).

— WALTER: 1175–90, died 27 Sept. Previously prior of Winchester.

WILLIAM DE BEAUCHAMP, son of Walter de Beauchamp, succeeded 1133, supported Stephen and succeeded Milo of Gloucester as constable, but joined empress in 1141; sheriff of Worcs to 1169 or 1170. On him see H. W. C. Davis in *Essays...presented to R. L. Poole*, pp. 169 ff.; Round, *Geoffrey de Mandeville*, esp. pp. 313–15.

WILLIAM DE CHESNEY, brother of the bishop of Lincoln and Gilbert Foliot's uncle, leading supporter of Stephen in midlands; probably died c. 1164–70. See H. E. Salter in *Cart. Eynsham*, i, 415–18; *GF*, pp. 33–4.

WINCHESTER, BISHOP OF, HENRY OF BLOIS: son of Stephen, count of Blois and Chartres, and Adela, daughter of William I, brother of King Stephen (see *GF*, p. 78 and n.). Monk of Cluny, abbot of Glastonbury 1126–71, bishop of Winchester, nominated 4 Oct., consec. 17 Nov. 1129, died 8 Aug. 1171. Knowles, *EC*, pp. 34 ff.; *Monastic Order*, pp. 287–93; L. Voss, *Heinrich von Blois* (Berlin, 1932).

— RICHARD OF ILCHESTER (or 'Tokelius'): related to Gilbert Foliot, clerk of Robert earl of Gloucester before 1147 (*GF*, p. 38), protégé of Becket (*MB*, iii, 120), royal clerk by 1159 (Lambeth MS 241, fo. 59v), archdeacon of Poitiers from 1162/3, el. bishop late April 1173, consec. 6 Oct. 1174, died 22 Dec. 1188. See *DNB*; Delisle, *Recueil*, Introd. pp. 431–4; C. Duggan in *Trans. Royal Hist. Soc.*, 5th series, xvi (1966), 1–21.

WORCESTER, ARCHDEACON OF, WILLIAM CUMIN: clerk of Bishop Geoffrey Rufus of Durham, chancellor of King David of Scotland, tried to seize bishopric of Durham after his uncle's death in 1141, condemned, excommunicated by the Pope, and removed from his benefices at the Council of London c. 14 March 1143 (Hexham, pp. 309, 313–14; Laurence of Durham, ed. J. Raine, *Surtees Soc.* lxx (1870), pp. 7–8, etc.; *PUE*, ii, nos. 29–31; cf. notes to *Councils and Synods*, i, forthcoming). The benefices included the archdeaconry of Worcester (Hexham, p. 314), which William had probably held since his predecessor's

death in 1125 (John of Worcester, p. 19). He was reconciled in 1144, and slowly recovered some of his benefices. He was clerk to Archbishop Theobald (occurs 1146–7, Saltman, pp. 538, 370, cf. p. 170) and Henry II, both before and after his accession (Delisle, *Recueil*, Introd. pp. 475–6 and 1, nos. lix\*, lxiii\*, cxxxiv; Z. N. and C. N. L. Brooke in *EHR*, LXI (1946), 85 n. He last occurs as royal clerk in 1156; the W.C. noted by Delisle in 1167–9 from *PR 14–16 Henry II* was probably a layman). This helps to explain the revival of his fortunes—partial restoration of benefices by 1152 (*PUE*, II, nos. 72–3; cf. Saltman, pp. 144–6); further restoration in 1156–7, which evidently included his archdeaconry (*JS Epp.* I, 47 and n., 48, 151–2), for he appears as archdeacon in 1157 (Saltman, pp. 501–2). Presumably the arrangement was that he should hold it for life, and his successor be restored after his death. Godfrey had been restored by 1161–2 (no. 345). It seems highly likely that *JS Epp.* I, no. 98, which refers to ‘the transaction of Godfrey and William’, is concerned with the disposal of some of Cumin’s other benefices; it has been dated 1158–60, but it refers to the wishes of the Pope, who must presumably be Adrian IV, and so was probably written in 1158–9. It therefore seems probable that William Cumin died c. 1158–9.

— MASTER GODFREY: 1144 (see nos. 33–4; occurs 1151–7, *Cart. Gloucester*, I, 263)–1156/7; restored c. 1158–9, died 1167 (see above; Ann. Tewkesbury and Worcester, *Ann. Mon.* I, 50, IV, 382).

WORCESTER, BISHOP OF, SIMON: chaplain and chancellor of Queen Adela (William of Malmesbury, *Gesta Pontificum*, RS, p. 290; John of Worcester, pp. 18–19), el. before 29 March, consec. 24 May 1125, died prob. 20 March 1150 (but see *GF*, p. 92 n.).

— MASTER JOHN OF PAGHAM: clerk of Archbishop Theobald, consec. 4 March 1151, died 31 March 1157 (cf. Poole, *Studies in Chronology and History*, pp. 271–2; on him see Saltman, pp. 116–17, 215).

— MASTER ALFRED: enthroned 13 April 1158, died 1160, 31 July. Previously royal clerk (Saltman, pp. 127–8; Delisle, *Recueil*, Introd. p. 354; *JS Epp.* I, 151 n.; cf. Ann. Winchcombe in *Misc. D. M. Stenton*, p. 131); possibly also clerk of the bishop of Bath and canon of Wells (*Cart. Bath*, I, 62, 64; *Cart. Bruton*, nos. 52, 54).

— ROGER OF GLOUCESTER: son of Robert, earl of Gloucester, el. March 1163, consec. 23 Aug. 1164, died 9 Aug. 1179 (buried at Marmoutier: T. D. Hardy, *Catalogue of Materials*, II, 416). On him see Oxford B.Litt. thesis by M. G. Hall (Mrs Cheney) (1940); Knowles, *EC*, pp. 22–3; *DNB*.

— BALDWIN: 1180–4 (see Canterbury).

— WILLIAM OF NORTHOLT: 1186–90 (see *GF*, p. 284).

WORCESTER, PRIOR OF, DAVID: el. 1143, deposed 1145 (Ann. Winchcombe, in *Misc. D. M. Stenton*, p. 129 n.; cf. *Cart. Gloucester*, I, p. lxxvi; no. 47 n.).

— OSBERN: 1145–c. 1146 (see above and no. 47; evidently Ralph succeeded between 26 Jan. 1146 and 27 Jan. 1147, because 26 Jan. 1148 (i.e. in this case from context 1149) fell in his third year: Worcester, Dean and Chapter Reg. A 4, fos. xv–xi).
