- I A twelfth-century bishop, possibly Gilbert Foliot (Kempley, Glos). (Photograph by the Rev. J. E. Gethyn-Jones.)
 - E. W. Tristram, English Medieval Wall Painting: the Twelfth Century (Oxford, 1944), pp. 42-4, 134-6, dates this wall-painting c. 1150. The bishop has no halo, so can hardly be intended for a saint. Kempley was in the diocese of Hereford, and had a link with St Guthlac's priory (Taxatio, p. 161). Gilbert Foliot is thus a possible candidate. But the date is far from certain, and Mr Gethyn-Jones tells us that there are grounds for an earlier date (possibly c. 1120; see his St Mary's Church, Kempley, and its paintings, 1 (1961), pp. 13, 65; a fuller study will appear in vol. 11).
