PREFACE

The present volume of *Studies in Church History* is the eighth to be produced by the Ecclesiastical History Society, and the third to be published by the Cambridge University Press, under an arrangement made for three years in the first instance. It is appropriate, therefore, to record the gratitude of the Society to the Syndics of the Cambridge University Press for the manner in which their undertaking has been fulfilled. The Society has never been so well served by its Publishers, as the success and wide circulation of recent volumes of *Studies in Church History* demonstrates. It is our hope that the basis of a long and fruitful collaboration has been established.

'Popular Belief and Practice' was the theme of the ninth summer meeting (held at Fitzwilliam College, Cambridge) and the tenth winter meeting of the Society. All the 26 papers included in this volume were read at one or other of these meetings, and are arranged in chronological order of subject matter.
