CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

R.G. Abrahams. Lecturer in social anthropology at the University of Cambridge, where he took his B.A. (1957) and Ph.D. (1962). He has done fieldwork among the Nyamwezi of Tanzania and the Labwor of Uganda, and is the author of *The Political Organization of Nyamwezi* (1967) and various papers.

Maurice Bloch. A graduate of the London School of Economics, where he is now a lecturer, Dr Bloch took his Ph.D at Cambridge in 1967. He did fieldwork among the Merina of Madagascar, and is the author of *Placing the Dead* (1971) and a number of papers, listed elsewhere in this volume.

G. I. Jones. Lecturer in social anthropology, University of Cambridge, author of *Basutoland Medicine Murder* (1951), *Report on the Position of Chiefs in Eastern Nigeria* (1957), *The Trading States of the Oil Rivers* (1963), and various papers.

Adam Kuper. A graduate of the University of the Witwatersrand, he took his Ph.D. at Cambridge in 1966. Recently on the staff of Makerere University, Kampala, he is currently a lecturer at University College, London. Has done fieldwork in Botswana, and is the author of *Kalahari Village Politics: An African Democracy* (1970) and various papers.

Audrey Richards. Formerly Smuts Reader in Social Anthropology and Director of the Cambridge University Centre of African Studies. Her numerous publications include *Hunger and Work in a Savage Tribe* (1932); *Land Labour and Diet in Northern Rhodesia* (1939); *Bemba Marriage and Modern Economic Conditions* (1940); *Chisungu* (1956); *The Changing Structure of a Ganda Village* (1966); *Multicultural States of East Africa* (1969).

A.F. Robertson. Took his Ph.D. at Edinburgh in 1967, and has since held a research fellowship at the Cambridge University Centre of African Studies: fieldwork in Buganda and recently a study of government and politics in Ahafo, Ghana.

Paul Spencer. Took an engineering degree at Cambridge before turning to anthropology. Did fieldwork among the Samburu and Rendile in East Africa and received his D.Phil. at Oxford in 1960. Has since been a member of the Tavistock Institute. Studied local government in Coventry, and was subsequently seconded to the Royal Commission on Local Government. Now working on aspects of the Health Service. He is the author of *The Samburu* and various papers.
