

> The poetry of Dante Gabriel Rossetti: modes of self-expression



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Note

Rossetti's life has been copiously documented. His brother, William Michael, wrote extensively about him and the list of subsequent biographies has recently been extended by the addition of D. G. Rossetti: An Alien Victorian by B. and J. Dobbs (London, 1977). The amount of biographical work far outstrips the attention given to the scope and nature of Rossetti's achievement as a poet, and since so much material on the life is available, biographical matters have been given only minimal attention in this book.
