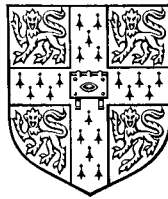

EDITOR'S PREFACE

This second number of *Sociological Studies* reviews some of the many complex aspects of migration and hopefully some of the fads and occasional foibles of contemporary theory in the social sciences. In this and subsequent volumes the chief aim will be to provide a basis from which to assess the adequacy and validity of the theoretical concepts available and their appropriateness in relation to research findings and techniques. Such an editorial aim should provide not merely indications of differences of approach and emphasis by an international group of scholars, representing different intellectual traditions, but will also, by serendipity as well as design, throw out new ideas and connections between different areas and topics studied by social scientists.

Although it is the editorial policy of *Sociological Studies* to print original papers reflecting the author's current research and thinking an exception has been made in this volume in order to include the paper by Professor Everett Lee since it seemed appropriate to do so. It was first published in *Demography*, 3, 1 (1966), pp. 47-57.

The themes of the next three volumes will be 'Professions and Professionalization' (1970), 'Role' (1971) and 'Social Change' (1972).

This will be the last of these volumes to be edited at the University of East Anglia. I should like to express a debt of gratitude to the University and especially its School of Social Studies for tangible assistance in the editorial work and preparation and to my colleagues and students whose stimulus and encouragement have done much to bring about and sustain this series.
