What is the self-concept, and how does it develop? Do people in different cultures have sharply different concepts of self? Can we believe what our informants tell us on this point? These are among the most hotly debated questions in the social sciences today.

This is the third volume organized around Ulric Neisser’s cognitive theory of self-knowledge; it goes beyond *The Perceived Self* and *The Remembering Self* to deal with some of the oldest – as well as some of the newest – psychological and philosophical questions surrounding the self.
