Although typically separated, philosophy and New Testament theology are mutually beneficial for the understanding of the distinctive wisdom that guides Christian thought and life. *The Wisdom of the Christian Faith* fills a major gap in the literature on the philosophy of religion. It is the first book on the philosophy of religion to be authored entirely by philosophers while directly engaging themes of wisdom in the Christian tradition. The book consists of all new essays, with contributions from John Cottingham, Paul W. Gooch, Gordon Graham, John Hare, Michael T. McFall, Paul K. Moser, Andrew Pinsent, Robert C. Roberts, Charles Taliaferro, William J. Wainwright, Jerry L. Walls, Sylvia Walsh, Paul Weithman, and Merold Westphal.

Paul K. Moser is Professor of Philosophy at Loyola University Chicago. He is the author of *The Evidence for God: Religious Knowledge Reexamined*, *The Elusive God: Reorienting Religious Epistemology*, *The Severity of God* (forthcoming), *Philosophy after Objectivity*, and *Knowledge and Evidence*. He is co-editor of *Divine Hiddenness* and *The Rationality of Theism*; editor of *Jesus and Philosophy* and *Rationality in Action*; a general editor of the book series *Cambridge Studies in Religion, Philosophy, and Society*; and editor of the journal *American Philosophical Quarterly*.

Michael T. McFall is Visiting Instructor of Philosophy at Bowling Green State University. He is the author of *Licensing Parents: Family, State, and Child Maltreatment*.
