



# Index

*Note:* The Table of Legislation on pp. 318–93, being arranged by subject, has not been indexed, except for named individuals and abbeys. To find references elsewhere in the book to the individual statutes and codifications printed in the Table, consult the entries for the relevant year under the headings ‘Chapter General, statutes of’, and ‘Chapter General, statutes of, codifications’.

Saints, monarchs and members of religious houses are normally indexed under their first name, with the exception of Irish kings and princes and of late medieval abbots and monks with genuine surnames. Bishops and lay people are generally indexed under their second name (where one is given), with the exception of most Welsh names and of those in the form ‘Hugh, son of Eudo’ or ‘Warin fitzGerald’, who are listed respectively under Hugh and Warin.

The abbreviations f. and affil are used for foundation and affiliation, the latter being taken to include connections both with the mother-house and with daughter-houses. Other abbreviations are standard.

Attention is drawn to the entries on iconography and ornament.

Plate numbers are in **bold type**, figure numbers in *italics*.
