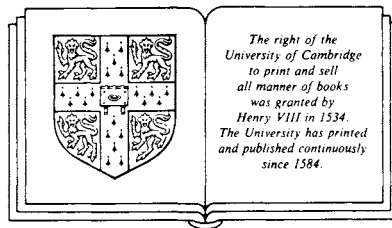

Acknowledgements

More than ten years have elapsed since Mary Douglas, back in June 1977, bought me half a pint of bitter in a pub not far from University College London and encouraged me to choose an Alpine village for my Ph.D. project and to integrate anthropological fieldwork with historical analysis. Since then my research has trodden unexpected paths. My Ph.D. dissertation still provides the foundation for the present volume – but more in terms of questions raised, perhaps, than in terms of conclusions arrived at. In particular, I gradually realized the crucial importance of investigating population dynamics in order to test models in ecological anthropology, and also became aware of the usefulness of going beyond the boundaries of community study and engaging in a comparative analysis covering the whole Alpine area. The broadening of the thematic and geographic scope of my study has led me to incur many intellectual and personal debts. I am grateful first of all to Phil Burnham, Rosemary Harris and Sally Humphreys, who supervised my work at the Department of Anthropology, University College London, and to the Italian National Research Council, the Central Research Fund, University of London, and the Folklore Fund, University College London, for supporting my field research in the Italian Western Alps. My first contacts with the Cambridge Group for the History of Population and Social Structure were instrumental in giving a marked historical-demographic orientation to my research. This orientation has then become even stronger through my close association with the Group since 1982. My greatest and sincerest thanks are due to Peter Laslett and Tony Wrigley, who both encouraged me to write this book and have been supportive all the way through. But I am also very grateful to all the other members of the Group, and particularly to Jim Oeppen for his help in statistical matters, and to Richard Wall who read large
