The collection of essays by prominent historians of the Reformation explores the experience of religious reform in 'national context', discussing similarities and differences between the reform movements in a dozen different countries of sixteenth-century Europe. Each author provides an interpretative essay emphasising local peculiarities and national variants on the broader theme of the Reformation as a European phenomenon. The individual essays thus emphasise the local preconditions and limitations which encountered the Reformation as it spread from Germany into most of the countries of western and central Europe. Together they present a picture of the many-sided nature of the Reformation as it grew up in each 'national context'. The book includes examples of countries where the Reformation was strikingly successful, as well as those where it failed to make an impact. A final comparative essay seeks to understand the different 'Reformations' as variations on an overall theme.

This volume forms part of a sequence of collections of essays which began with *The Enlightenment in national context* (1981) and has continued with *Revolution in history* (1986), *Romanticism in national context* (1988), *Fin de siècle and its legacy* (1990), *The Renaissance in national context* (1991), *The Scientific Revolution in national context* (1992), and *The national question in Europe in historical context* (1993). The purpose of these and other envisaged collections is to bring together comparative, national and interdisciplinary approaches to the history of great movements in the development of human thought and action.

WIEBE BERGSMA is a research fellow at the Fryske Akademy, Leeuwarden, Netherlands and has published various articles on the Reformation in the Low Countries.

PATRICK COLLINSON is Regius Professor of Modern History at Cambridge University and author of numerous works on English protestantism, including *The Religion of Protestants* (1982) and *The Birthpangs of Protestant England* (1988).

JULIAN GOODARE is a Royal Society of Edinburgh Research Fellow in the University of Edinburgh, working on the finances of the Scottish state 1560–1637 and is currently preparing a book on *The Government of Scotland 1560–1625*. His 1989 Ph.D. thesis on the Scottish parliament won the Hume Brown Senior Prize in Scottish History.

MARK GREENGRASS is Senior Lecturer in Modern History at the University of Sheffield. He has published *France in the Age of Henry IV* (1984) and *The French Reformation* (1987), and has edited *Conquest and Coalescence. The Shaping of the State in Early Modern Europe* (1991).

OLE PETER GRELL is a Carlsberg Fellow at the Wellcome Unit for the History of Medicine, University of Cambridge. He has published articles on the Danish Reformation as well as the monograph *Dutch Calvinists in Early Stuart London* (1989), and has edited, with Andrew Cunningham, *Medicine and the Reformation* (1993).

HENRY KAMEN is Professor of History at the Institut Milà i Fontanals in Barcelona. He is the author of several books on early modern Spain, the latest of which is *The Phoenix and the Flame. Catalonia and the Counter-Reformation* (1993).

FRANTIŠEK KAVKA has published in both Czech and German numerous works on the Hussite movement, the history of the University of Prague and economic and political problems of the sixteenth century. From 1964 he was Professor of Czech History and head of the Institute of History at

Charles University. In 1970 he was obliged to give up his activities in teaching and scholarship, and returned to them only in 1990.

**KATALIN PETER** is Scientific Councillor at the Institute of History of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences and has published books and articles on the history of early modern Hungary, especially in recent years on the Reformation.

**BOB SCRIBNER** is Reader in the Social History of Early Modern Europe at Cambridge University and Fellow of Clare College. His most recent publications include *Popular Culture and Popular Movements in Reformation Germany* (1987); *The German Peasants' War: A History in Documents*, with Tom Scott (1991); *The Reformation in Germany and Switzerland*, with Pamela Johnson (1993).

**SILVANA SEIDEL MENCHI** is Professor of History at the University of Trent and has worked on various aspects of humanism and the Reformation in Italy. Her numerous publications in Italian, German and English include *Erasmus in Italia 1520–1580* (1987).

**JANUSZ TAZBIR**, is Professor in the Institute of History, Polish Academy of Sciences, Warsaw, of which he has been a member since 1983. He has numerous publications in several languages on the history of Polish culture and religious movements. He is editor-in-chief of the annual publication *The Renaissance and Reformation in Poland* and his more recent publications include *La République nobiliaire et le monde. Etudes sur l'histoire de la culture polonaise à l'époque du baroque* (1986); 'The popular impact on the discovery of America in East Central Europe', *The Polish Review* 3 (1993); and *The Reformation in Poland* (1993).

**KASPAR VON GREYERZ** is Professor of History at the University of Zurich, and has published on the Reformation in Germany and Switzerland, the historiography of popular religion, and religious autobiographies of the seventeenth century. His most recent book is *Vorsehungsglaube und Kosmologie. Studien zu englischen Selbstzeugnisse des 17. Jahrhunderts* (1990).
