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This book provides an authoritative account of Hegel's social philosophy at a level that presupposes no specialized knowledge of the subject. Hegel's social theory was designed to reconcile the individual with the modern social world. Michael O. Hardimon explores the concept of reconciliation in detail and discusses Hegel's views on the relationship between individuality and social membership, and on the family, civil society, and the state.

The book is an important addition to the group of major studies of Hegel published by Cambridge University Press. It will interest a broad swathe of readers in philosophy (both students and specialists), and it can be used in courses on political and social theory.
