PREFACE

This book sets out to provide a short critical biography of Bellini, seen in his historical context. Most of it rests on a fresh examination of published sources. The one matter on which I have done a good deal of new archival research is the identity of three people Bellini associated with in Paris; so as not to clutter up the narrative, this is dealt with in the Appendix. I have also drawn on my earlier research into the Italian opera industry and the singing profession.

Such a book would not normally call for much if any annotation, apart from the Appendix, where new matter, potentially controversial, demands precise references. As the Introduction explains, however, the published evidence for Bellini's career is flawed and some is faked. This is the first book to challenge it radically – though only by applying the normal methods of historical criticism. Where I deny or cast doubt on the validity of supposed documents I need to give evidence and reasons. This has meant some (at times long) notes, which readers may choose to take in or not.

Quotations from Bellini's letters are generally followed by the date(s) of the letter(s) in brackets. This makes it possible to follow up the sources in the collections listed in the Note on further reading; nearly all are in Bellini's *Epistolario*, ed. L. Cambi, Milan, 1943.

I have been considerably and kindly helped with information and documentation by Lorenzo Bianconi, Peter Day, Salvatore Enrico Failla, Simon Maguire, Pierluigi Petrobelli, and Alessandro Roccatagliati. My thanks to all of them, and to the librarians of the Bibliothèque de l'Opéra, Paris, and the Library of Performing Arts, New York.
