The names of medieval authors and works are entered here as they appear in the text, that is, usually in their English form. I have alphabetized medieval authors by first name, except as necessitated by established tradition, as with Geoffrey Chaucer.

Where medieval language is at least sometimes inclusive, I have subsumed specific terms under general. Thus “seed, females’ ” includes references to women’s seed. Where the medieval material, taking the male and heterosexual cases to be standard, identifies “special” cases, this is indicated by the presence of separate subheadings (or occasionally headings), as in “desire, sexual, homosexual.” Where medieval usage is exclusive, the headings reflect this, as in “intercourse, heterosexual.”

A page number followed by an “f” indicates that the reference is to a figure.
