Eighteenth-century landscape description was a discourse in which the nature of liberty and authority was debated – a vital discourse in a Britain defining its nationhood in the contexts of growing imperial power and rapid economic change. Tim Fulford examines this discourse in the writings of Thomson, Cowper, Johnson, Gilpin, Repton, Wordsworth, Coleridge and others, arguing that it is the site of culturally revealing tensions which arose as writers both struggled for authority over the public sphere and sought to redefine the nature of that authority.

Dr Fulford investigates political and aesthetic writing as well as poetry and throws new light upon the legacy of Commonwealthsman and Country-party ideas of liberty. He discusses the significance of the Miltonic sublime, the politics of the picturesque and the post-colonial encounter of the Scottish tour. He intervenes in the critical debate over the politics of Romanticism by showing Wordsworth's and Coleridge's early radicalism and later conservatism to have been shaped as much by their ambivalent emulation of/definition against the political and literary authorities of eighteenth-century England as by their response to the French Revolution and the rise of Napoleon. Containing both historicist and rhetorical criticism of canonical and non-canonical writers, Dr Fulford's quietly innovative study will be of interest to all those looking for an understanding of literary and political influence that cuts across conventional periodization and finds new links between the early eighteenth and nineteenth centuries.
