Index

This is a book about political and social ideas and how these have been used for rhetorical and eristic purposes; none of which have been straightforward, either in intention or in execution. The language is therefore full of synonyms and tropes. To have indexed all of these would have been to rewrite the book, they have therefore been indexed in clusters.

For example: there is no reference to England; instead there is an entry for 'Mother England' which also subsumes 'mother land' and 'parent state'. There are no subentries for America – which is a very long entry – because all those who referred to America made use of the country and its history as a paradigm of 'what might happen if ...'. Finally there is no entry for revolution – which wasn't ever an issue, although the word was used; 'separation/severance' was what was really at stake.

Because most of the terms used are rhetorical concepts it has in many cases not been possible to subdivide the entries. If this is irritating to some readers it at least has the merit of being shorter than a word-list type index and I hope more useful to those who are interested in the underlying structure and development of the arguments described.

Illustrations are given in *italic*, but are not separately indexed where there is already a main entry. There is a separate index of prominent persons and also of the newspapers – the primary evidence for the debate.
