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The recent opening of the archive of the former Congregation of the Holy Office of Rome (the office of the ‘Inquisition’) has yielded an extraordinary wealth of documentation which is already altering dramatically many long-standing views on the repressive activity of the Church of Rome during the Counter-Reformation.

Drawing extensively upon this archival source, the book highlights the wide gap between the Church’s aim to exert control over all knowledge and actual implementation. The plurality of the central offices, their contradictory decisions, and the inadequacy of the peripheral offices combined to hamper truly effective censorship. But despite their shortcomings, these operations had a disastrous effect upon Italian culture. The pointless destruction caused by the Church’s waverings, and the failure of expurgatory policy, for centuries deprived Italians of their most cherished books. By concentrating on areas hitherto little explored, this book shows that prohibition did not affect only the scholarly community. Broader social groups, from jurists to scientists, from Jews to ‘common’ readers uneducated in Latin, all experienced the rigours of ecclesiastical censorship.
