Hidden animals

Aim	To revise the alphabet and practise animal vocabulary
When to use	The activity can be used after the Vocabulary section on page 53 of the Student’s Book.
Language focus	animal vocabulary from Unit 6
Key vocabulary	bear, bird, cat, cow, dog, dolphin, fish, frog, horse, monkey, mouse, penguin, rabbit, sheep, spider, tortoise
Skills focus	Speaking
Preparation time	5 minutes
Activity time	25 minutes

Before class

Make one copy of the game board sheet per two students. Cut along the dotted lines.

In class

- 1 Divide the class into pairs. Give one student in each pair the Student A card, and one student the Student B card. If possible, sit the students back-to-back so that they can’t see each other’s cards.
- 2 Explain the rules of the game:
 - Each player has eight animals on his/her grid. Their opponent must find out what these animals are.
 - Players take it in turns to ask questions to find out which squares on their opponent’s grid have a letter in them. For example:
B: *Is there a letter in D1?*
A: *Yes, P.*
 - If there is a letter, the player writes it in the correct square on his or her blank grid. In the example above, player B writes P in square D1 of grid A. If there is no letter, the player puts an X in that square.
 - If a player thinks they can guess an entire word and its coordinates, they can tell their opponent by saying ‘I think this word is (dog). It is in squares E11–G11. You spell it d-o-g.’ If the player spells the word correctly, they win the word. If they make a mistake, they lose their turn and have to wait until their next turn to try to guess the correct spelling of the word again.
- 3 Students play the game until one player has found all of their words. When one student from each pair has won the game, go through the answers as a class by asking individual students to give the coordinates of the words on the boards.

Variation

This activity can be used to revise most of the vocabulary sets in the book. Simply photocopy four of the blank grids onto one page and add the vocabulary of your choice. This can then be photocopied and distributed to students.

Past simple quiz

Aim	To revise past simple questions using regular and irregular verbs
When to use	The activity can be used after the Grammar section on page 54 of the Student’s Book.
Language focus	past simple questions, regular past simple verbs
Key vocabulary	album, the Eurovision Song Contest, the First World War, the Moon, the Tour de France
Skills focus	Reading, speaking
Preparation time	5 minutes
Activity time	20 minutes

Before class

Make one copy of the sheet per three or four students.
Fold the piece of paper along the dashed line.

In class

- 1 Divide the class into groups of three or four. Give each group a sheet with the question side facing up. Tell them that they can’t turn it over yet. Explain to students that they are going to do a quiz, but the first thing they must do is write the questions.
- 2 Students work together and fully form the questions on the sheet. For example, the first question should be *How long was Cleopatra Queen of Egypt?*
- 3 When students have finished forming the questions, check with the whole class that the structures are correct. (See opposite.)
- 4 Tell students to unfold their sheets. Explain that they have all of the answers to the questions there, but that they are not in the correct order. Give them five minutes to decide which are the correct answers to the questions.
- 5 Go through the answers in open class, making sure students are using the language correctly. Ask students how many answers they got correct.

Variation

This activity can be made more challenging by asking the students to write a guess for each question before they look at the answers.
