This index contains alphabetical entries to ancient authors and also to individual works discussed and quoted in the text. The index references sites both by page number and by Figure number of the map on which the site appears; monuments are found in Rome unless otherwise noted. Romans have been referred to by their most familiar name, despite the inconsistency involved; we thus find in order, for example, Aemilius Paulus, Lucius; Caesar, Gaius Julius; Mark Antony; Postumus, Marcus Cassianus. Unfamiliar terms can additionally be found in the Glossary, which also contains entries for authors and works, political figures, and abbreviations.
