All ancient writings cited in the Translation are listed here by author, including some who remain “Anonymous.” Only material ostensibly from an author’s writings is included; strictly oral remarks, even verbatim quotations, appear only when cited from a written work, and under the author’s name, not the speaker’s. Citations are normally flagged in the Translation by abbreviated references in square brackets, often by “F” for “fragments” or paraphrases. The collections and editions from which those references derive are indicated here following each author’s name. Citations from an author’s extant works appear first, then fragmentary material; citations found in different collections are listed on separate lines; and citations not found in the specified collections are listed last, separated by a semi-colon. The Index also lists the sources of fragmentary material for ancient authors cited only in the notes, but not citations found only there.
