Abstract: Questions are raised about Christian philosophy and God. Is Christian philosophy truly philosophical? Is it biblical? Is it capable of addressing God, a profoundly transcendent being? Does appealing to a God's-eye point of view make sense? Can Christian philosophy respect religious diversity? While the integrity of Christian philosophy is defended, questions are raised about its relationship to the overall practice of philosophy. Christian philosophers value drawing others to Christian faith. Are Christian apologetics compatible with philosophy? This Element concludes with reflections on when it may be philosophically acceptable to appeal to mystery.
