## **Introductory Note**

References such as '178–9' indicate (not necessarily continuous) discussion of a topic across a range of pages. Wherever possible in the case of topics with many references, these have either been divided into sub-topics or only the most significant discussions of the topic are listed. Because the entire work is about 'outbound investment', the use of this term (and certain others which occur constantly throughout the *Casebook*) as an entry point has been restricted. Information will be found under the corresponding detailed topics. Cross-references in a form such as 'companies. *See also individual companies*' direct the reader to headings in a particular class (e.g., in this case 'ByteDance') rather than a specific 'individual companies' entry.
