The negotiation of a patchy but burgeoning network of international investment agreements and the increasing use to which they are put is generating a growing body of jurisprudence that, while still evolving, requires closer analytical scrutiny. Drawing on many of the most distinguished voices in investment law and policy, and offering novel, multidisciplinary perspectives on the rapidly evolving landscape shaping international investment activity and treaty-making, this book explores the most important economic, legal and policy challenges in contemporary international investment law and policy. It also examines the systemic implications flowing from frenetic recent judicial activism in investment matters and advances several innovative propositions for how best to promote greater overall coherence in rule-design, treaty use and policy-making and thus offer a better balance between the rights and obligations of international investors and host states.

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PREFACE

Launched in 1997, the World Trade Institute (WTI) annual World Trade Forum has established itself as an important hub for leading experts from academia, governments, international organisations and civil society to brainstorm, from a multidisciplinary perspective, on the new and unsettled challenges in global economic governance and to identify forward-looking solutions.
