Divided Kingdom brings new clarity and breadth of treatment to the subject, integrating political, economic, social and cultural history alongside the international and imperial context. Highlighting changing living standards and expectations and inequalities of class, income, wealth, race, gender, sexuality, religion and place, this book analyses what has (and has not) changed in the United Kingdom since 1900, why, and how, helping the reader to understand how contemporary Britain, including its divisions and inequalities, was formed.

Exploring what has divided the United Kingdom and what has held it together, and challenging conventional interpretations, such as the 'dull' and culturally conservative 1950s and the 'swinging sixties', key themes include nationalisms, the rise and fall of the 'welfare state', economic success and failure, social movements challenging the status quo, the decline of colonialism and its impact, and relations with Europe.

PAT THANE is a Research Professor in Contemporary British History at King's College London. Previously Professor of Contemporary History at the University of Sussex and the Institute of Historical Research, University of London, she has been a Visiting Professor in New York, China, Australia, Japan, Taiwan and Chile. She is also a convenor of History and Policy and President of the Social History Society UK and a Fellow of the British Academy.
