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Bold face is used for references where the entry gives special attention to the topic at hand (even when only one reference is cited).

Lower case italics are used for terms that refer to items of material culture or to the practice of fieldwork.

Foreign language terms are given in quotes.

References are given to sections where an item is mentioned, so that one may find contiguous pages cited side by side. The goal is to indicate the full context within which each reference fits.

Authors are cited in the index only when they appear in the text, not when they are cited in the inline references.

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
