

THE EU SUCCESSION REGULATION

The European Succession Regulation is a landmark in the field of EU private international law. It unifies the conflicts of laws, jurisdiction and recognition of foreign judgements, and of some other legal instruments in the field of succession and wills. This volume provides an article-by-article commentary on the individual provisions of the regulation, introduced by an overview of its general framework and underlying principles. As a reference tool for the regulation, this book is intended to promote a high standard of interpretation and application. With contributions from leading scholars in the field, it uses a comparative approach in its analysis to enrich the academic debate and highlight the problems likely to arise in the practical application of the regulation.

ALFONSO-LUIS CALVO CARAVACA studied law at the University of Murcia (LLM, Extraordinary Award, 1976) and at the University of Bologna (PhD, Vittorio Emanuele II Award, 1978). Since 1992 he has been Professor of Private International Law at the University Carlos III of Madrid. Formerly he was Professor of Private International law at the University Autónoma of Madrid and at the University of Murcia; visiting professor at UNESP in São Paulo (1993), at ITAM in Mexico, D.F. (2001), and at the School of Law of the University of Bologna (2012). Since 2009 he has been the co-director of Cuadernos de Derecho Transnacional (CDT), published by the University Carlos III in Madrid. From 2005, he has been a permanent member of the General Codification Commission (Civil section) at the Spanish Ministry of Justice. From 1988, he has been a member of the Hamburger Freunde des Max Planck Instituts für ausländisches und internationales Privatrecht. From 2012, he has been a Fellow of the European Law Institute, and from 2015, a titular Member of the International Academy of Comparative Law (IACL).

He is author, co-author, editor or co-editor of approximately 300 publications in the fields of private international law, EU antitrust law, international commercial law, among which, in particular, *Derecho Internacional Privado*, vol. I (with J. Carrascosa González) and *Derecho Internacional Privado*, vol. II (with A.-L. Calvo Caravaca.), published in Granada, Editorial Comares, now at their 15th edition.

ANGELO DAVÌ is a Professor of Private International Law and of Public International Law on the Faculty of Law at the University of Rome "*La Sapienza*" and formerly a Professor at the Universities of Cagliari, Catania and Florence. He was a member of the Italian Delegation at the XVIth



> Session of the Hague Conference of Private International Law in 1988, when the Succession and Wills Draft Convention was adopted, and he was invited in 2004 to present a report on the issue of applicable law at the conference held in Brussels for discussing the study "Conflict of Law of Succession in the European Union. Perspectives for a Harmonisation" made by the Deutsches Notarinstitut, upon request of the EU Commission, in view of the adoption of a EU regulation on matters of succession and wills. He is the author of several monographs and articles in legal journals in the areas of private international law, public international law and european law, as well as a comprehensive commentary of the EU Succession regulation together with Professor Alessandra Zanobetti, published in 2014. A lecturer at the Hague Academy of International Law, Davì taught a course entitled "Le renvoi en droit international privé contemporain", which was published in the Academy Collected Courses in 2012 (vol. 352) and awarded the prize for 2013 of the Italian Ministry of Culture, upon selection by the Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei. He is a member of the Italian Bar (Rome), admitted to practice before the Italian Supreme Court.

> HEINZ-PETER MANSEL is the Director of the Institute for Private International and Comparative Law at the University of Cologne (Germany) and holds the Chair for Private Law, Private International Law, Comparative Law and Civil Procedure Law. FOREWORD AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

As from 17 August 2015, all Courts and other authorities within the European Union Member States (with the exception of Denmark, Ireland and the United Kingdom) have to apply in matters of cross-border succession and wills the Regulation (EU) No 650/2012 on jurisdiction, applicable law, recognition and enforcement of decisions and acceptance and enforcement of authentic instruments in matters of succession and on the creation of a European Certificate of Succession.

With this Regulation, European Private International Law has erected a new corner stone of unification. The Regulation has broken with some national traditions in autonomous private international succession law, such as the nationality principle, which was central for a number of European legal systems, or the application of different succession laws for movables (*lex loci domicilii*) and immovables (*lex rei sitae*), as it was known in French – and English – inspired conflicts laws. The Regulation is a comprehensive codification of private international law of succession and wills, including jurisdiction, recognition and enforcement of judicial decisions and authentic acts, and the establishment of a European Certificate of Succession.

This article-by-article Commentary aims to provide help and advice for the application of the Regulation in legal practice, to secure a high standard in its autonomous interpretation and to enrich the scholarly discussion. It may be useful also for practitioners of third countries, or of Member States not bound by the Regulation, having to deal with a succession connected with one or more Member States which are bound by this instrument. The fact that the authors come from different Member countries and that most of them have an international background has prompted the adoption of a comparative and genuinely European approach in the analysis of the regulation.

The book's origins lie in the European Commission Research Project "The Europeanization of Private International Law of Successions" (JUST/2013/JCIV/AG/4000004710) led by Angelo Davì. As the editors,
