# **Preface**

Practitioners of obstetrics and gynecology must have a thorough understanding of the breadth of the subject matter while also accepting the challenge of comprehending the depth of information required to give outstanding patient care to women. *Obstetric Care* is the second book in a series of three texts that cover the breadth of the Ob/Gyn specialty. Modern Ob/Gyn leaders divide our specialty into three divisions: office practice, obstetrics, and gynecology. *Office Care of Women* was the first book in this series and *Gynecologic Care* rounds out the subject matter. After a thorough understanding of the specialty, readers can then move on to literature review or subspecialty texts to further their knowledge on the depth of obstetrics and gynecology.

The care of pregnant patients is uniquely satisfying. The practice of obstetrics combines the need for outstanding technical skills with the intellectual challenges of medical management for both maternal and fetal conditions. Outstanding psychosocial skills combined with crisis management abilities are also essential. The volume of material covering these and other topics within the discipline of obstetrics is vast. This book is tightly written and is designed to be read in its entirety. The basic information provided here can be used as a review or as a springboard to a more knowledgeable review of the literature in depth.
