P R E F A C E

THE COUNCIL wish to acknowledge their great debt to Mr E. Alfred Jones of Clare College who in the first instance volunteered to make a detailed description of the College Silver. The thoroughness and scholarship of his notes suggested to the Council that they might be incorporated in a permanent record of the Plate and Pictures, and he has edited the silver section in its entirety.

They are also deeply indebted to Mr J. W. Goodison, M.A. of the College, and Assistant Marlay Curator of the Fitzwilliam Museum, for placing his expert knowledge at their disposal and spending so much of his spare time in cataloguing and describing the pictures.

NOTE. Apart from the list of early donors of plate, the record is confined to what is now in the possession of the College. No further reference, except on p. 69, has been made to plate which it once had and which has been lost or sold or exchanged—except where existing items are the proceeds of earlier ones which have been melted down, and these are ascribed to the original donors.

It may however be of interest to point out that in 1772, by vote of College, a large exchange of “the useless for the necessary” was carried out. This exchange, together with the colossal theft from the Treasury in 1796, has sadly impoverished the collection.
