NOTE ON THE FOOTNOTES

All references to Boyle's works are to the folio edition of 1744, unless specific reference is made to the quarto edition of 1772. Both were edited by Thomas Birch, who prefixed a life of Boyle. Here, unless otherwise specified, references to this life are to the separate edition of 1744. References to the *Sceptical Chymist* are to the Everyman edition. The manuscripts referred to are almost all in the Miles collection of Boyle papers in the Royal Society.
