## P R E F A C E

**M**Y old students, Mr Eric Philip and Mr T. W. Manson, have read this work in proof. To Mr Manson, whose knowledge of Hebrew idiom is vastly greater than mine, I owe a good many suggestions. Yet in spite of his help, there is more Hebrew idiom than my translation shows, and especially in the effect of the participle and the sequence of tenses. I am also indebted to Mr J. M. Edmonds of Jesus College, Cambridge. Not only is he very learned in all such matters generally, but he has done a similar work on Theophrastus, which gave him an especial interest as well as special knowledge. He thought the general reasoning sound, and took more trouble than I know how to acknowledge, to make the argument clearer and the translation more precise. Prof. J. M. Creed has given me some valuable criticisms from the standpoint of one who still favours the view that the condition of the text is due to conflation of sources. The note at the end is mainly an attempt to deal with them, though one or two of the criticisms are from others.
