The current text as printed in the editions of the Talmud is revised by the aid of *codex* Oxford, *codex* Epstein, and of quotations. The revised text and a second recension "which has hitherto existed only in Manuscript [so far as was known to S., only in a Vatican MS. (Assemani Catalogue, no. 303); from a Munich MS. S. Taussig published a part in his *Neweh Shalom* (1872)], are printed in opposite columns. In the notes I have pointed out the parallel passages to either recension. A somewhat elaborate introduction seeks to explain the genesis of the tractate, its relation to contemporary Rabbinic literature, and the character of the MSS. The copious notes and appendices are intended to supply the student with helpful material towards a better understanding of the text." Short notice upon the issue of the first sheet in *J.C.* July 3, 1885, p. 5. S. is advised to append "a full list of the numerous abbreviations which he employs in his footnotes"; he heeded the advice, and added a short list of uncommon abbreviations. Short notice also in *Neuzeit*, Jahrg. 25, 1885, p. 246.
