PREFACE

THIS volume contains a selection of articles which seemed to deserve publication in a permanent form, collected from the numerous contributions made by the author to classical periodicals during the last thirty years; six papers not hitherto published, and one essay which originally formed part of *Studies in Horace*, a book now out of print. The selection was made by Dr Verrall, in compliance with the suggestions of friends, in the spring of 1912, and it was confirmed by the present editors, by whom the essays have been revised and prepared for the press. In only one or two places do the editors think that the author might have wished to make modifications which seemed beyond their competence.

In the case of republished articles, the names of the Journals and Reviews in which they originally appeared are given in the Table of Contents, and where the date of publication of a particular essay seemed to be of importance a footnote giving this

has been added ad loc. The dates of composition of the hitherto unpublished papers are not known with precision; some of them are fairly recent, while others were written a good many years ago. Most of them were probably read at meetings of the Cambridge Philological Society, or of some other.
