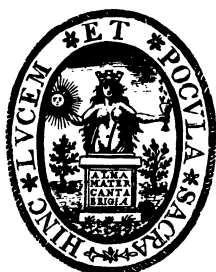

P R E F A C E

When I had the honour, in 1921, to be appointed Ford Lecturer at Oxford, Professor Firth, that great historian, great teacher and generous counsellor to budding historians, explained to me that Ford Lecturers were expected to publish the gist of their lectures in book form; and he went through the list of past Lecturers, noting those who had complied with this condition and those who had not. I fear I have been slow in following his instructions; for my *Stanhope* did not appear till 1932, and this little sketch of my other two subjects, Carteret and Newcastle, makes its appearance over twenty years after the Lectures were delivered.

That I am enabled to publish this last instalment in difficult times such as these is due to the generosity of the sister University's great Press: for this and for the scholarly care with which it has been printed and illustrated I am deeply indebted.
