Since there is not a single bibliographical reference system including all books printed after 1500 and thus placing individual works in a larger context, no attempt is made here to index the references given in the text to a variety of catalogues and bibliographies. For incunabula, only the *Gesamtkatalog der Wiegendrucke* and F. R. Goff's *Census* are indexed. Both are a convenient entry point to the ISTC database, and lead to further bibliographical information. In a few rare cases, by default, L. Hain's *Repertorium Bibliographicum* and M. F. A. G. Campbell's *Annales*, both with supplements, are quoted.
