NOTE BY THE LIBRARIAN.

THE history of the work which this index volume completes goes back to 1892. In that year Mr Sayle circulated privately proposals for a 'Hand-list of Early English Books in the University of Cambridge to A.D. 1640,' in the preparation and publication of which the colleges and libraries concerned were to be asked to cooperate. This more comprehensive scheme came to nothing. But in May, 1894, the Library Syndicate, after much careful consideration of alternative methods, invited Mr Sayle to proceed with the preparation of a catalogue of the Early English Books contained in the University Library.

Three years was mentioned as the time which would be occupied in making such a catalogue. If the three years have grown to twelve¹, those who have watched the progress of the work are satisfied that the time has not been wasted. No one who has not tried to catalogue early books has any conception of the difficulties that constantly stop the explorer's progress.

The work had hardly begun when the death of Mr Samuel Sandars deprived the Library of a liberal and judicious benefactor. The stream of donations which had flowed since 1870 ceased; but he bequeathed to the University his library, which included more than 400 of the books with which this Catalogue is concerned, together with a sum of £500 to be spent on similar books. He had already contributed largely to this class, nos. 18*b*, 26, 47, 49, 55, 86, 100, 112, 141, 148, 995*b*, 997 being among those for which the Library is indebted to him. The books which formed part of his own collection are distinguished in the present work by the mark 'Sandars Collection'; and it will be observed that the only Shakespeares we possess come from this source.

About 200 books have since been given by various donors, and about 1560 have been bought. Thus the collection is larger by about a third than it was when Mr Sayle began the preparation of his Catalogue.

I am sorry that it was not found possible to note, as the work went on, the source from which each book came to the Library. In many cases it would have been easy, but in others it would have taken time; and the task was already complicated enough. Cuthbert Tunstall's *de arte supputandi* (no. 280) was given by the author in 1522. Archbishop Parker and the other Elizabethan benefactors were more concerned with precious manuscripts and with standard editions printed abroad: but Parker gave some, perhaps all, of the historical works in the publication of which he himself was concerned.

At the end of the sixteenth century the University printers probably sent their books direct to the Library¹, and some are still here marked 'Sum Academiae Cantabrigiensis.' King James I and Francis Bacon presented their works in 1620. (See nos. 2807 and 3497.) But it is not till the middle of the century that any considerable arrival of books has to be recorded. From 1646 to 1662 Archbishop Bancroft's library, brought from Lambeth when bishops were abolished, formed part of the University Library: but in the latter year it was restored to Lambeth. Fortunately Dr Holdsworth, Master of Emmanuel, who died in 1649, had foreseen this possibility; and had provided for it by a codicil added to his will. So by the loss of Bancroft's 12,000 volumes the University became entitled to Holdsworth's 10,000. This bequest was the subject of a dispute between the College and the University. The whole story will, I hope, be told by Mr J. W. Clark when he takes in hand the *Annals of the Library*: but one consequence of the dispute was the formation of an unusually precise catalogue of the whole collection. Most of the books, Fathers, Schoolmen, Councils, Aristotelian Commentators, etc., are of course foreign: but I have been able to pick out 876 English books printed before 1641: and of these no less than 606 appear to be still in the Library. I have accordingly made a table shewing under what numbers in the present catalogue books from the Holdsworth Collection are to be found.

The unique folio *Directorium sacerdotum* printed by Caxton is no longer here: stolen about 1778, it is now in the British Museum. But the *Mirror of the World*, the *Festial*, and the *Golden Legend* remain, as well as the Ales and Lattebury printed at Oxford (nos. 74 and 75).

The dispute over Dr Holdsworth's books was not terminated till December, 1664. In the meantime Henry Lucas died, leaving his valuable library¹ to the University. It contained upwards of 230 books of the class which is contained in this Catalogue. Lucas's volumes are almost always distinguished by his name or initials, in welcome contrast to Holdsworth's, which (except in the case of a presentation copy) contain no trace of his ownership.

Bishop Hacket's bequest in 1670 contained some 200 early English books (e.g. nos. 162, 439); but I know of no other event deserving of mention here until we come to the year 1715, when King George presented to the University the library of the late Bishop of Ely, John Moore. It is well known that to this gift are due most of the Caxtons, Wynkyn de Wordes, and other early 'black-letter' books which the University possesses: but it is equally certain that in the thirty-five years which elapsed before the collection could be properly housed, large numbers of books were stolen; how many we have no means of ascertaining.

From 1778 to 1797 Dr Farmer held the office of Proto-Bibliothecarius. Unfortunately his private collection never became part of the University Library, though its existence sometimes led bibliographers to describe books belonging to it as 'in the Public Library.'

More than the first half of the nineteenth century passed without any notable addition, so far as I know. Then books began to come in. In 1870, Henry Bradshaw gave his Irish collection, to which, on his death in 1886, his executors added a second Irish collection together with his breviaries and other liturgical books. Some of these are distinguished in the first two volumes of the present Catalogue by the mark 'Bradshaw Collection': in the third volume they have ordinary class-marks; but it may be mentioned that the Irish books, marked 'Hib,' were mostly his. The books themselves may in all cases be identified by a stamp or label.

NOTE

Dr Venn's large collection of works on Logic, presented in 1889, contained only nine English books before 1640: the library of Professor Adams, bequeathed in 1892, added 139; in both cases the class-mark preserves the donor's name. I have already spoken of the Sandars Collection. On the whole, more books have been given in the last forty years than in the hundred and fifty which preceded them. Lord Acton's vast collection, presented in 1902 by Mr John Morley, hardly concerns us now; for, incredible as it may appear, among the 60,000 or more volumes which composed it, less than 30 were English before 1640.
