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*** In compiling this Index an endeavour has been made to observe as much of vernacular uniformity as seemed attainable, without violating settled usage. All Saxon names, for example, which begin with EAD will be found under ED; those which begin with ECG under EG; and those which begin with Æ, will commonly be found under E. Mere contractions, like Algar, Almar, Aldred, and Athulf, will be found under Ethelgar, Ethelmer, Ethelred, and Ethelwulf, respectively. Ælfred and Alured appear under the time-honoured form of Alfred. Errors there are sure to be,—sometimes from oversight and sometimes from ignorance,—and for these the searcher's indulgence is solicited.

The ordinary numerals 1-280 refer to the text; from 281, onwards, to its Appendices. The Roman numerals refer to the Introduction and its Appendix.

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
