Educated at Cambridge and Berlin, he came to public attention in 1882 following the publication in *The Times* of a series of articles on the persecution of Jews in Russia that had followed the assassination of Alexander II. The Mansion House Committee to aid the Jews of Russia was established as a result of these articles. In 1885 he published this book, listing all the printed works on the 'Jewish Question' that had appeared in the previous decade. It is notable that those items originating in Germany form the bulk of the bibliography, providing as much material as all other countries combined. Revealing in its scope, this has been described as the most important contemporary bibliography on the subject.

## P R E F A C E.

IN the following list an attempt has been made to collect together all the literary productions emanating from either side in the so-called Jewish Question under its Protean aspects in Europe and America during the decade 1875–1884. It is intended to include books, pamphlets, speeches, reports of meetings and societies, anti-Semitic newspapers and articles in non-Jewish periodicals, especially when signed. Articles in Jewish papers (of which a list is given in Singer 480) are excluded, except when reprinted, and the Broadsheets (108–120), Posters (389–401), and pieces of Music (318–9), are only selected specimens. As a clue to general press utterances the index to the *Times* (332) may suffice.

The arrangement is alphabetical under authors' names, the anonymous articles being collected together, also in alphabetical order, under that heading (11–76, 532–8). The following Analysis may serve as a rough guide to the multifarious contents of the list, the anonyma being indicated by short titles in italics, the remainder by author's name. Numbers are added where doubt might occur. Asterisks mark specially important or interesting works.

## PREFACE

French, Hebrew, Hungarian, Roumanian, Italian, Russian, Dutch, Spanish, Polish, Danish. Of these, however, 417 are press notices tabulated under Nos. 52, 332, 335, 371b, 371c, 379a. Of the remainder 496 are pamphlets (34 being translations), of which 186 are Antisemitic, 295 Prosemitic, and 15 Conversionist. I cannot refrain from pointing out the obvious moral of these figures, that the over-eagerness of Jews to defend themselves has clearly only served to add fuel to the flames by which they were being roasted.

Extensive as it is, the list, drawn up far from the centre of the conflict, is probably not complete: no bibliography ever was. But I trust no important utterance has been omitted, as I have been favoured by Messrs. Dulau and Co. with access to a very extensive collection of German pamphlets in their possession, while Prof. Kaufmann of Buda-Pesth has kindly favoured me with the Hungarian items to which his initial is attached. I have also received much aid from three lists in Steinschneider's *Heb. Bibliog.* vols. xx. and xxi., as well as from the excellent bibliographical lists of M. Isidore Loeb in the *Revue des Etudes juives*. It seemed to me worth while aiming at relative completeness, as the only notice that most of the works mentioned in this list deserve is that of being included in some such bibliography.
