Wakefield Court Rolls.

COURT held at Halifax on Monday after the Invention of the Cross (May 3) 14 Edw. II [1321].

Adam del Bothes surrenders the eighth part of one toft, one bovate and nine acres in Ourom, in the graveship of Hiperum, which were demised to Robert of Werlulley, chaplain, to hold according to custom, etc. And Robert gave 16^d for entry.

PLEAS and PERQUISITES of the Soke of Wakefield from the Vigil of St. Gregory [March 12] 16 Edward II [1322-3] until in the time of John de Doncaster holding the place of Steward.

COURT of the King held at Wakefeld before John de Donecastre, on Friday, the Vigil of St. Gregory (March 12), 16 Edw. II [1322-3].

Ellen de Rastrik fined 2^d for pasturing her cattle on the said Thomas's grass; damages, 40^d

Henry de Walda, 3^d, for not prosecuting the said Thomas.

. . . Hugh s. of Hugh de Lighesils, sues Roger de Grenewode for trespass, the judgment to be given by Richard de Birton. Surety—John de Grenegate

. . . John Evotsone does not prosecute suit against John de Bradeforth; his fine forgiven, because he is poor.

. . . John Elyotsone fined 2^d for false claim against John Kaynock.

Bailiff. John le Rede of Pudsey and Ralph de Schefeld, agree. John puts himself in mercy; 6^d

Stanley. Walter Ginne, 3^d for not prosecuting John Tyting.

Bailiff. John del Bothem sues John s. of Robert de Methely, for detaining a cow worth 20^s. Defendant is to make his law. Surety—John Dade.

Sandale. Roger de Bordewricht sues John s. of Thomas de Crigelston, and Robert s. of Hugh, for debt. Surety—German Swerd.

Stanley. Emma Ginne fined 2^d for not prosecuting suit against Walter Ginne.

Hiperom. Simon del Dene, 6^d for the same against Adam Prestman. Roger Clifton was surety for the prosecution.

. . . Adam Prestman, attached to answer Roger Clifton for seizing his cattle in Hiperom, at a place called Lightcliff, and driving them to Henry de Coldeley's house in that town, is to make his law. Surety—Adam de Middelton.

Robert Johanstepson le Pynder fined . . . for not prosecuting similar suit against Adam le Prestman.

Rastrik. Thomas Taluace and John del Clay of Eland, 6^d for the same against Thomas de Totehill.

Hugh de Totehill sues Robert de Soureby, Adam de Middilton. Thomas of Haytefeld, Roger de Grenewode and Richard de Waddesworth for debt. Surety—John de Gaygrave.

. . . John son and heir of Thomas de Heton, deceased, does fealty for the tenements he holds of the King, and fines 2^s for respite of suit till Michaelmas.

Adam de Everingham, 6^d, and John Drak, 3^d for default. Henry de Walda, 3^d for default.

Holne. Henry s. of John del Standbank, surrenders 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres in Wlvedale, which are granted to John del Grene, who pays 2^s for entry.

Hiperom. John s. of Roger de Clifton, pays 3^s to the King to take for 12 years all the lands that William del Bothes held in the bounds of Hiperom, with William s. and heir of the said William del Bothes, whom he will maintain honourably, finding him in all necessaries. Surety—Roger de Clifton.

Ossete. Agnes d. of Richard s. of Bate, surrenders $\frac{1}{2}$ bovate of land in Ossete, and it is committed to Thomas, s. of Richard . . . 2^s for entry.

Alverthorp. Richard de Colley surrenders a rood in Alverthorp, and John Gerbot another rood, both of which are committed to Julian d. of Robert ad Ulmum, who pays 6^d for entry into each.

Horbiry. Hugh in le Wro fines to the King 18^d as a heriot on $\frac{1}{2}$ bovate and $\frac{1}{2}$ acre in Horbiry, after the death of Robert del Wro, his father.

Alverthorp. Roger le Bordwricht and Alice, his wife, and Christian, sister of Alice, surrender 2 acres in Alverthorp, which are committed to John s. of Hobbe; 12^d for entry.

. . . John Gepstone, 6^d . . . Richard Stele 6^d for dry wood.

Stanley. John Isabell's wife, 6^d; John, s. of Simon Tyting, 2^d; William de Schefeld, 6^d, for coal and vert.

Stanley. Walter Gunne sues Robert . . . for trespass. Surety—Philip Gunne.

Rastrik. Thomas Taluace sues Thomas de Totehill. Surety—the bailiff of Rastrick.

Bailiff. John s. of Richard de . . . sues John de Ryley for trespass. Surety—John Clerk of Sandale.

Sandale. Elias de Doncastre sues John del Dene for debt. Surety—Thomas de Holgate.

Bailiff. Henry Nelot sues Emma Fairhegh for debt. Surety—Thomas Tabernator (le Taverner).

Sandale. Richard le Litester of Walton sues William le Parmenter on an agreement. Surety—Adam de Wodessom.

Robert s. of William de Walton, sues Henry s. of Hugh, for debt. Surety—John Clerk.

Stanley. Agnes widow of Hugh le Chapman, fined 2^d for not prosecuting suit against Hugh Forester.

Alverthorp. William Hodelyn and John Gerbot (2^d) agree.

Bailiff. John s. of Robert de Metholey, wages his law against John del Bothem; fine, 2^d

John de Burgh, who holds the manor of Walton in chief from the King, to be distrained for homage and fealty; and fined 6^d for defaults.

Horbiry. John de Hopton sues Adam Hoperborn for 29^s 5^d, for which John s. of Hugh was surety. An inquisition is to be taken.

Bailiff. John s. of Richard de Wodesom (fine pardoned) and John de Ryeley agree.

Ossete. Elias de Doncastre sues John del Dene for 5^s 4^d, the price of a stone of wool; the debt is acknowledged; fine 3^d

Stanley. John de Metholey sues John del Bothom for 4^s in silver, and 2 bushels of corn worth 4^s. An inquisition to be held as to 1½ bushels in dispute; the rest acknowledged; fine 2^d

. . . Adam de Everingham, John de Nevill and Ralph de . . . fined . . . for defaults.

Robert s. of Geoffrey de Stanley, is dead . . .

Ivo Faber surrenders 2 acres in a clearing . . .; they are committed to John de Gayrgrave; 6^d for entry.

Robert Hode of Neuton surrenders half a "broddole" in the great meadow of Alverthorp, which is committed to Philip D . . . 6^d for entry.

Hugh s. and heir of Robert s. of Geoffrey de Stanley, who held 2 bovates by homage, came and did fealty for the same, he pays 8^s 6^d a year, does suit every three weeks, and will give the King 17^s for a relief.

. . . The widow of Walter del Spen, 2^d; the wife of Robert s. of Walter del Spen, 2^d; John Hockespore's wife, 2^d; John Wlmer, 3^d; Beatrice L . . . lynde, 2^d for dry wood, &c.

Wakefeld. John de Skulbrok's wife, 2^d; Margery Junne, 2^d; Ibota Sparwe, 2^d; Robert Prest's handmaid, 1^d for dry wood.

Bailiff. Eva widow of Robert le Draper of Stanley, who was seised conjointly with her husband of 2 bovates in Stanley, surrendered her rights therein by charter to Hugh, her son, who did fealty and is received to do suit and other services. An ox to the Steward.

John s. and heir of Thomas de Burgh, does fealty and homage for the manor of Walton, and pays 2^s to have respite of suit till Michaelmas. An ox to the Steward.

Sandale. Roger le Bordwricht agrees severally with John s. of Thomas de Crigelston (2^d) and Robert s. of Hugh (3^d).

John de Hopton essoins against John Elyotson of Horbiry by William de Castilford. Surety—John Chicch.

John Elyotson fined 2^d for default at last court.

John de Hopton essoins against John Hudson, by William de Castilford. Surety—John Bond.

. . . Agnes widow of Hugh le Chapman, and Richard Colley (2^d) agree. Surety—Roger le Bordewricht.

. . . John de Holgate essoins against John Gos by John Paterik. Surety Robert Teller? (*Tell*).

Robert s. of William de Walton, 3^d for not prosecuting suit against Henry s. of Hugh.

John de Metholey, 6^d for the same against John del Bothom.

Agnes widow of Hugh Chapman, and Hugh Forester have a love-day.

John Attebarre sues Richard del Ker for 6^s 8^d, which defendant acknowledges, and is fined 6^d

A bovat of land, acquired by Robert de Holand, from John de Ayketon in Crigelston fields, is committed to William s. of Robert de Crigelston, at 3^s rent; and he will do to the hermit of Conigsburgh for the time being the service belonging to his hermitship.

John Kyde of Wakefeld surrendered a curtilage and buildings in Thornes, which is committed to John de Gayregrave; and he has entry without fine, because he is in the King's service.

John de Flanshou surrenders 1½ acres, which are committed to Thomas Bate; entry, 12^d

Alice Filkock stepdaughter of Thomas More sues William s. of Roger de Snaypthorp, for debt. Surety—William s. of Robert de Crigelston.

John de Nevill, 6^d for default.

Richard Withehounds surrendered $\frac{1}{2}$ rood in Alverthorp, which is committed to William de Lockewod and Alice his wife; without fine, because in the King's service.

John Torald surrenders $2\frac{3}{8}$ acres, in which Thomas s. of Laurence has a term for 20 years; they are committed to Matilda wife of the said Thomas. She pays 6^d for the recognition.

Richard Wythehounds surrenders $1\frac{1}{2}$ rood in Alverthorp; committed to John de Grenegate; entry, 6^d

Richard de Colley surrenders 3 acres in Alverthorp; committed to John H . . .leson; entry, 12^d

John de Grenegate gives 6^d to take $1\frac{1}{2}$ rood of meadow in Alverthorp from John Gerbot, for 12 years.

Ralph s. of Laurence, Elyas Tyrsi, Augustine Skinner and William Bate, 6^d each, for putting their beasts by night in the lord's meadows.

Philip de Castelford, 6^d and Thomas le Gardiner, 3^d for the same.

Thomas de Bellehous sues William Maunsel of Owendene for debt. Surety—Roger de Grenewode.

An inquisition finds that Robert s. of Adam de Neubygging, ousted James Monck from the vesture of a rood of land; to pay 12^d damages, and 6^d fine.

Stanley. Also that John Poket insulted Alice wife of Robert le Leper. Damages, 12^d; fine, 6^d

Also that Henry Poket slandered the same Alice, by means of which her husband lost 40^s. Fine, 2^s

Also that Henry Poket detains 4^s 8^d from Alice Sourhale, which he owes her under an agreement, by which she undertook in return to withdraw from a matrimonial suit. Fine, 3^d. Sureties for the fines, and for the payment of 40^s damages to Robert le Leper—Richard Pescy, Richard Poket, Richard del Kerre and John Poket.

Bailiff. Robert Pelleson and James del Okes (2^d) agree by licence.

. John s. of Elyas, and Hugh in le Wro, acknowledge themselves bound to John de Hopton, clerk, in 16^s 1^d

A jury finds that Henry de Batelay and Robert Sonman receive from the tithes of Ossete, which they bought from Germanus Filcock, 2 bushels of corn, value 3^s 4^d, and 4 quarters of oats, value 18^s besides the depredations (*ult^a dep'dacoēs*) made in the said tithes. They are to satisfy him; fine, ? 6^d

COURT held at Halifax on Monday, the Feast of St. Mark the Evangelist (Apr. 25) 16 Edw. II [1323].

Bailiff. Richard de Holynrakes; Richard s. of Adam; John de Skyrccote; Richard del Bank, and Adam de Sothehagh, 3^d each for not coming.

Sourby. Hugh s. of Hugh de Lichesels, plaintiff (6^d) and Roger de Grenewod, agree on two matters.

New Rent. Robert de Sotehill gives 12^d to take a rood of new land in Warwolfley wood; rent 1½^d

Ellen and Isabel daughters of Robert de Weswode of Warwolfley, surrender an acre in Warwley; committed to William le Westerne; entry, 6^d

Thomas Eschefeld surrenders ½ acre in Soureby; committed to John s. of Thomas . . . feld; entry, 6^d

3½ acres in Sourby, seised into the lord's hand on the death of Henry Miller; committed to Alice his daughter. Heriot, 12^d

8 acres in Soureby seised as above on the death of Richard del Feld, committed to Adam his son; heriot, 2^s

Adam s. of Henry de Soland, surrenders 14 acres in Soland; committed to Henry s. of Hugh; entry, 4^s

Matilda widow of Elyas, sues Hugh Wade and Julian his wife, for 7^s 4^d for flour bought from her; the debt to be recovered; fine, 3^d

Adam Attetounend surrenders 1½ acre in Soureby; committed to Richard s. of Beatrice; entry, 12^d

William Maunsel of Ovendene fined 2^d for not coming.

Thomas de Waddesworth surrenders 4½ acres in le Mithomrode; committed to John his son; entry, 4^s

Hugh Wade (2^d) and Robert de Saurby agree.

Ivo de Saltonstall sues Richard de Okelsley, Robert de Saurby, Thomas de Saltonstall and William s. of Gilbert de Halifax, for 6^s; the debt is acknowledged; fine, 8^d

Henry del Lone surrenders 2½ acres in Soureby; committed to Adam s. of Hugh de Lichesils and Alice his wife; entry, 12^d

William s. of Hugh de Lichelsils, surrenders a curtilage and 6 acres in Lichesils in exchange with Henry del Lone; Henry pays 3^s for entry.

Henry del Lone surrenders 5 acres in Lichesils in exchange with Adam s. of William de Lichesils; Adam pays 18^d for entry.

John de Soland surrenders 3 acres in Soland; committed to Henry s. of Henry; entry, 12^d

Thomas del Feld and Hobbekin s. of John (3^d) agree.

Bailiff. The jury (not enumerated) say that Michael de Routonstall, Adam de Bredensik, living in Langfeld, Robert de Rischelegh, Thomas del Castelstede, Roger Forester, Robert del Bothe, Adam Cappe, William s. of Hugh de Lighchesels, Richard de Windhill, Thomas s. of Eva de Halifax, Roger Spilwode, John Sutor, Henry s. of William de Halifax, John Bridde, Robert Wyldebore and Robert del Skoles, indicted elsewhere at other tourns for divers thefts and felonies, have not yet been delivered as they ought to have been; they are therefore to be taken.

The above Robert de la Bothe and Roger Forester stole cattle from Richard de Byrton's enclosure, belonging to Adam de Holdene and John de Scolfeld's wife; and are notorious thieves; Cecilia wife of Robert de la Bothe, is likewise guilty. Roger s. of Robert del Holme, stole 2 cows at Walleschaghes; Richard del Holme and Malle Colle broke into the house of John s. of Ivo, Christian Wynter sheared five sheep belonging to her mother, and carried off the wool, Thomas s. of John de Haldeworth, stole an old trokettum; value 3^d. To be attached.

William de Sunderland blocked up a path that used to lead to the common pasture; 12^d

The township of Sourby present that Roger de Grenwode stole 2 calves, value 5^s from John s. of Roger de Saurby, which are now a calf and an ox in the custody of Michael de Marchdene at Marchdene. He is to be taken.

Roger de Grenwode drew blood from Hugh Wade; 12^d

Isabel wife of Roger Spillewod from Thomas le Tincler, in self-defence.

William s. of German de Grenwod, and Richard his brother, thieved cattle belonging to Michael de Routonstall, William del Estwode, Alice del Clogh and Adam de Claiton. To be taken.

Elias de Waddesworth and Matilda his wife, stole a brass pot worth 5^s from William Snayppe. To be taken.

Robert Notyng thieved 40^s from the house of Robert Carpenter his father, while the said Robert was on his death-bed; and after his death, William Miller, the executor, threatened the said Robert Notyng, so that he brought the money back. Robert is to be taken for the theft, and William for receiving stolen goods.

John s. of German de Grenwode, and Robert del Bothe, assaulted a strange man at Whitolre, and took from him a horse and cart, etc.

. . . Robert de Risshe worth (3^d) and said Adam agree, also Simon del Dene (3^d) and said Adam.

. . . An inquisition finds that Thomas de Totehill maliciously detained Henry le Wricht's cattle, fine, 6^d

Henry de la Wald sues Roger de Hasilhirst for 2^s 6^d; the debt is acknowledged; fine, 6^d

Hiperom. Robert de Soureby sues John le Pynder, Adam s. of Henry, William del Rokes and Roger de Clifton for 11^s for 2 cows bought from him; the debt is acknowledged; fine, 6^d

. . . Thomas de Lynlay proves against Richard de Lethridge, that he is detaining 10^s from him, a debt for land bought; fine, 6^d. Surety—Henry le Waynwricht.

Hiperom. An inquisition finds Julian del Whitehill complained without cause against Henry le Waynwricht in a plea of dower, because her husband was not seised of the land in question after he married her; 2^d for false claim.

Also that Jordan le Pynder is wrongfully withholding 5½^d from Beatrice, widow of Alexander le Waynwricht. Fine, 6^d. Surety—John del Bothe.

Also that Thomas del Rode is withholding 5 quarters of oats from Matilda d. of John del Holway, which he ought to have paid her 10 years ago; he is to pay; fine, 6^d. Matilda fined 2^d for false claim against Thomas. Surety—Simon del Dene.

John de Schepedene, 2^d for not paying Roger de Hasilhirst 3^s 6^d for a bacinett bought from him.

John s. of Adam de Hiperom sues Robert de Soureby and John le Pynder for 2 quarters of oats for which they were sureties for Alexander le Waynwricht, now dead; they are to pay; fine, 4^d

Rastrik. Richard s. of Henry de Rastrik, gives 2^s as a heriot on 8 acres in Rastrik on the death of his father.

Hiperom. William de Sunderland surrenders a message and 8 acres in Schepedene; and afterwards takes them for his life, with remainder to John his son, who pays 3^s. The tenement lies between that of Henry Faber and le Raggedbirk, and Frankleysker and Shepedenbirk in the other direction.

William Swayppe, the lord's villein (*nativus*), died intestate; and Robert chaplain, his brother, constituted himself executor, and . . . the goods and chattels of deceased and has received 4^s, 3 horses, etc. etc. from John Drak. The cattle to be taken into the King's hand, and Robert attached.

William brother of Andrew, formerly forester in Hyperom, and John s. of Gilbert Bridd, stole 3 oxen from William de Sundirland, two from Henry de la Rode, and two cows from Robert del Southdene. To be taken.

Juliana widow of Thomas del Whitehill, drew blood from John Drak, 12^d

Thomas de Totehill, from John de Dighton, 12^d
