Printing and Publishing History

The interface between authors and their readers is a fascinating subject in its own right, revealing a great deal about social attitudes, technological progress, aesthetic values, fashionable interests, political positions, economic constraints, and individual personalities. This part of the Cambridge Library Collection reissues classic studies in the area of printing and publishing history that shed light on developments in typography and book design, printing and binding, the rise and fall of publishing houses and periodicals, and the roles of authors and illustrators. It documents the ebb and flow of the book trade supplying a wide range of customers with products from almanacs to novels, bibles to erotica, and poetry to statistics.

Bibliotheca Askeviana

The library of the physician Anthony Askew (1722–72) was outstanding in both printed books and manuscripts. He may have failed in his ambition to secure a complete collection of every printed edition of the Greek classics, but he did amass a classical library which remained unsurpassed until Spencer. Although he was later accused of plagiarism, virtually every edition of Aeschylus down to the 1850s cited 'Askew's collations'. He also secured Richard Mead's fine collection of Latin and Greek manuscripts, alongside other early classical codices from the Maffei library. The dispersal of Askew's collection in two sales, ten years apart, attracted international interest. Bidders at the 1775 book sale included George III, while the manuscript sale in 1785 led to acquisitions by the British Museum, the Bodleian and Cambridge University Library. Now reissued together, the sale catalogues have been annotated here by auction attendees who recorded prices and some purchaser details.

IT is thought unnecessary to say much with respect to this Library of the late Dr. ANTHONY ASKEW, as the Collector was, and the Collection is so well known in almost all parts of Europe: I shall therefore only beg leave to mention the manner of taking the Catalogue, and of some few particulars.

IN ORDER to render this CATALOGUE of *very rare and valuable Collection of Books*, as useful to the Public as possible, it is form'd into four different Alphabets, *English, French, Italian and Spanish, and Greek and Latin*; the Italian and Spanish Books (being few) are put in one Alphabet, and the Greek and Latin in one Alphabet also, because the two Languages are so frequently connected.—The Books and Tracts that are bound together of various Authors, (*of which, many are extremely rare and curious*) are all put in the last Day's Sale, as it was impossible to put them in the same alphabetical Order with the others.

The Compiler hopes to be excus'd the Errors that may appear in the Catalogue, as he is conscious it is not without many, owing in some

CONDITIONS of SALE.

1st, **T**HAT the Person who bids most is the Buyer; but if any Dispute arises, the Book or Books be put up to Sale again.

2d, That no Person advance less than Six-pence each Bidding; and after the Book arises to One Pound, no less than One Shilling.

3d, They are supposed to be perfect; but if any should be found otherwise before taken away, the Buyer is at his Choice to take or leave them, as no Book is to be returned after Delivery.

4th, That each Person give in his Name, and pay Five Shillings in the Pound (if demanded) for what he buys; and that no Book be delivered in Time of selling, unless first paid for.

5th, The Lots must be taken away at the Buyer's Expence, and the Money paid at the Place of Sale, within six Days after the Sale is ended.

Any Noblemen or Gentlemen who cannot attend the Sale, may have their Commissions faithfully executed,
