*Peuctrus de morbis contagiosi*, &c. There were likewise two *theses*, or disputations, published upon it; one by *Twestrengk*, at Basil, in the year 1581, and another by *Hambergerus*, at Tübingen, in the year 1586. One *Gul. Lemnius*, a Zealander, is said to have wrote upon the scurvy. He seems to have been a very trifling author, believing it to be the same disease in man that the measles distemper is in hogs. It would appear from *Solomon Albertus*, that his performance was out of print in the year 1593.

(*b*) It was one of the most celebrated faculties of medicine at that time in Europe; of which *Olaus Wormius*, two of the *Bartholines*, and *Simon Paulli*, were then members. The latter, who was physician to the King of Denmark, has usually been ranked among the writers on the scurvy, upon account of an appendix which he added, *ann.* 1660, to his *Digressio de vera causa februm*, &c.
