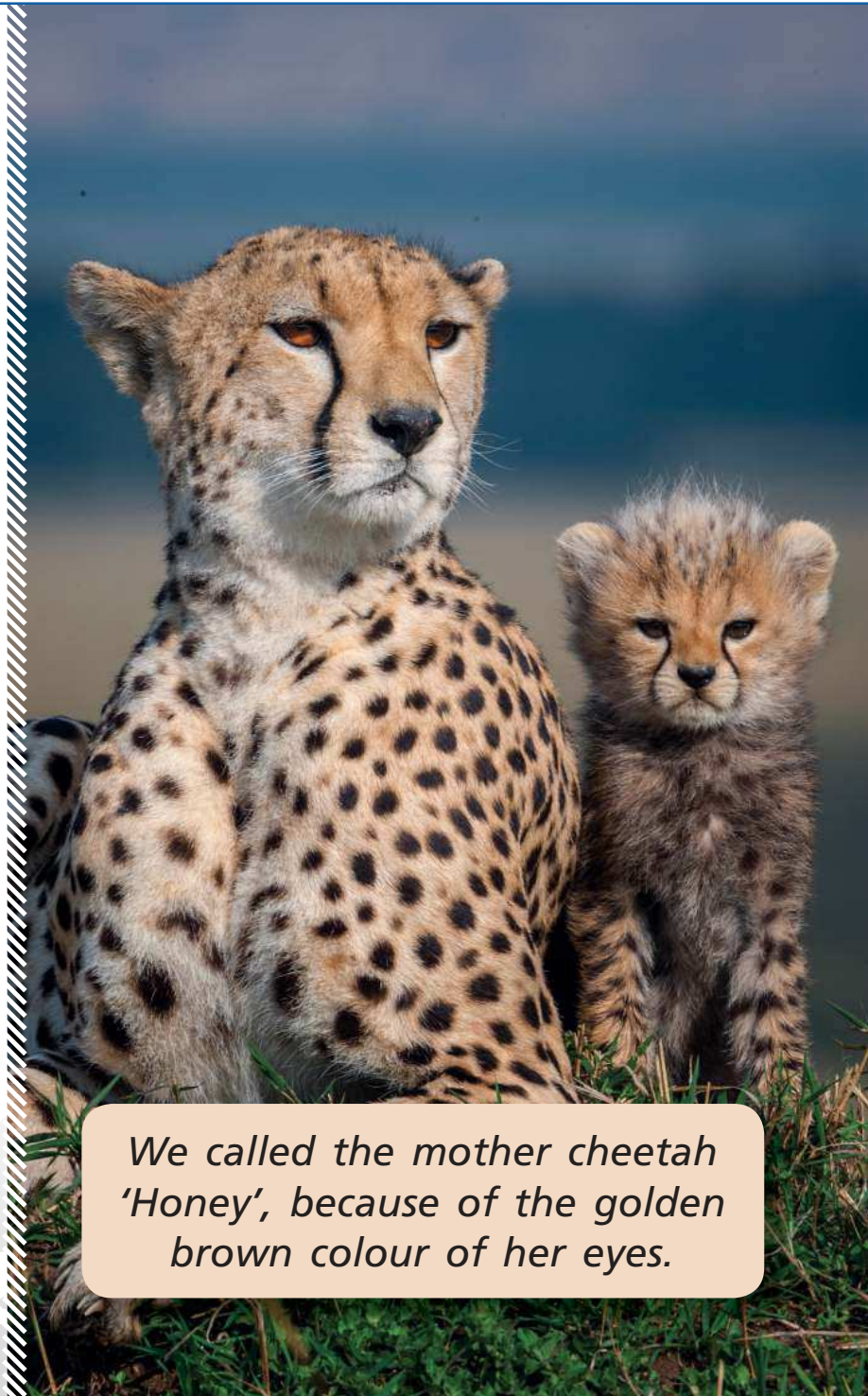

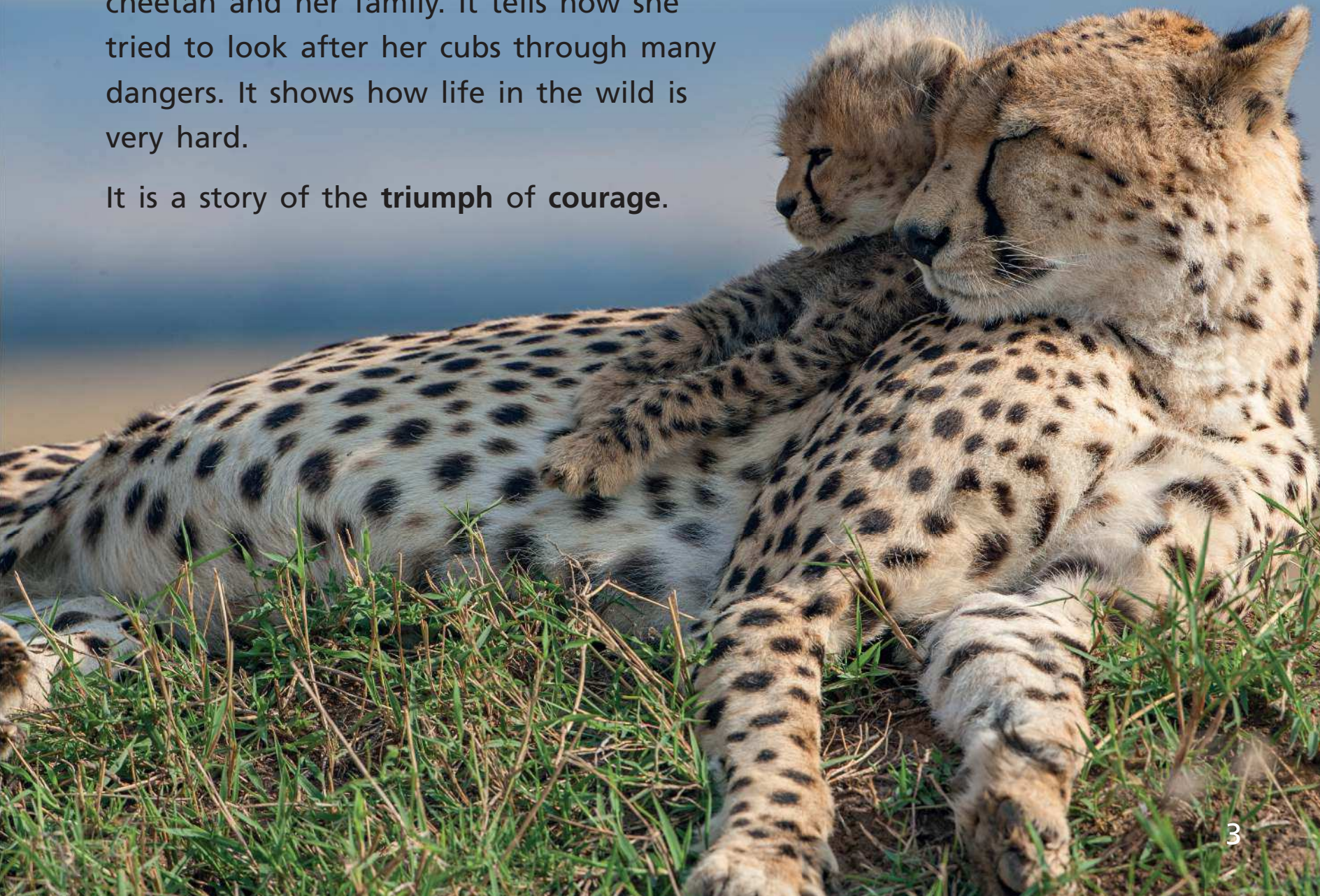


We called the mother cheetah 'Honey', because of the golden brown colour of her eyes.

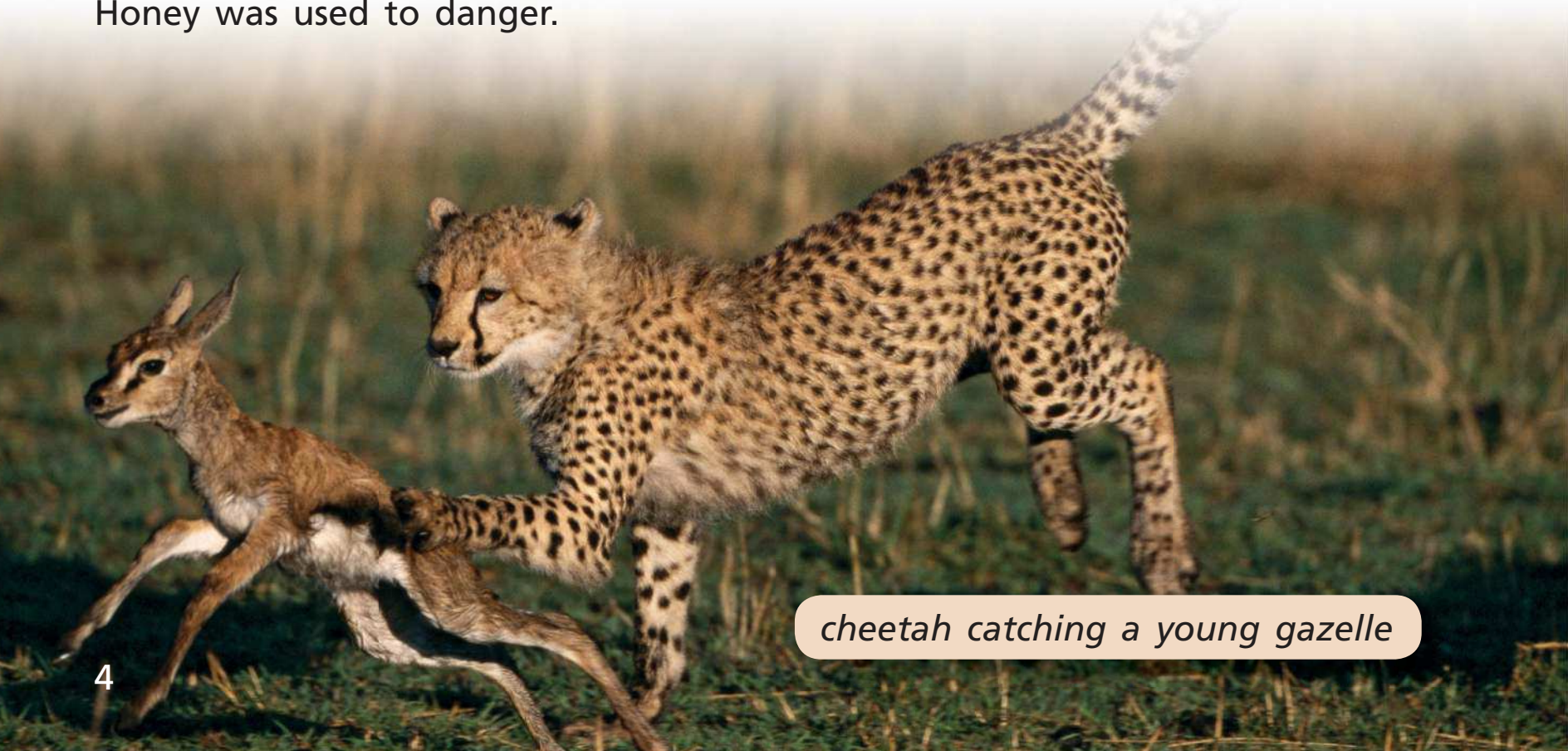
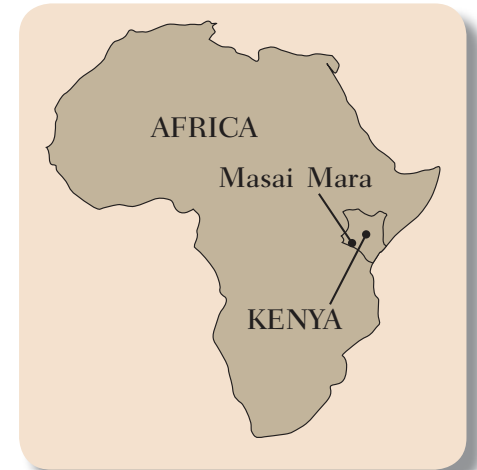
This is the true story of a brave mother cheetah and her family. It tells how she tried to look after her cubs through many dangers. It shows how life in the wild is very hard.

We meet Honey the cheetah

We first saw Honey in the Masai Mara, in Kenya, Africa. She lived on the wide African **plains** where cheetahs have many enemies. Cheetahs are the fastest animals on Earth, but they do not have the strength to fight lions, or leopards, or even **hyenas**. So, like all cheetahs, Honey was used to danger.

Fact Box

Cheetahs can run at 70 miles per hour.

Cheetahs cannot run fast for long. They must catch their prey quickly.
